

**UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA**

University of Oklahoma sophomore Jacob Dalton won the 2011 Winter Cup all-around title and regained his position on the U.S. Senior National Team late Saturday night. Overall, one third of the national team will remain from the University of Oklahoma men's program.

Dalton is the second straight Sooner to win the all-around at the Winter Cup. In 2010, current OU graduate assistant coach Chris Brooks claimed the crown.

Joining Dalton on the U.S. National Team are Brooks, sophomore Alex Naddour, senior Steven Legendre and Olympic silver medalist Jonathan Horton. The four Sooners showcased their talents in the sport Saturday night at the Winter Cup Challenge in Las Vegas, Nev., as three of the four current Sooners sent to the event were selected to the national team following strong performances.

Dalton and Naddour were the latest to be named to the team, while Brooks, Horton and Legendre automatically retain their spots on the national team as members of the 2010 World Championships Team.

Dalton, a three-time All-American, claimed the all-around title for the weekend after he posted a two-day total of 176.250. Posting an all-around score of 88.150 on the final night, the Reno, Nev., native also claimed the floor (16.150) and vault (16.550) event titles.

Naddour, right behind Dalton in fourth place, finished the weekend with a two-day total of 170.750. The 2010 NCAA pommel horse champion raised his first day scores to finish the final session with an improved 85.850 all-around score.

Legendre, a six-time NCAA National Champion, sat out the all-around but finished the weekend fourth on vault with a combined score of 31.750.

Sophomore Chris Stehl had his best Winter Cup showing this weekend finishing in 15th place with a combined all-around score of

162.950.

**STANFORD UNIVERSITY**

The Stanford gymnastics team had some exceptional results at the Winter Cup Challenge that will help decide the U.S. National Team. Josh Dixon and Tim Gentry set themselves up for potential spots on the team after a pair of top-8 finishes.

Dixon led the Cardinal, placing sixth overall. The Cardinal senior scored 168.800 over two days to likely earn his spot on the national team. Dixon's best event was the floor exercise where he had scores of 15.050 and 15.450 to place second overall on that event. He also performed well on the vault where his scores of 15.250 and 15.600 were good enough for sixth overall.

Gentry was also impressive, potentially earning his spot on the national team by placing eighth with all-around scores of 81.850 and 85.650 for a two-day total of 167.500. Gentry excelled on his best event, the still rings with scores of 14.700 and 15.050 to place second overall.

A pair of Cardinal freshmen also fared well with Chris Turner placing 18th with a two-day total of 161.400 and Cale Robinson placing 27th with a score of 137.050. Turner had a best event finish of 10th on pommel horse, placing 10th overall with scores of 13.400 and 13.300. Robinson did not technically compete in the all-around as he only participated in five of the six events. Robinson was outstanding on vault with scores of 15.950 and 15.850 to place third in the event.

Senior Alex Buscaglia also had a solid meet, placing 23rd in the all-around. He scored 157.650 after scores of 77.150 and 80.500. Buscaglia excelled on horizontal bar where he is the defending Pan-American Champion. His scores of 15.800 and 14.900 were good enough for second in the event.

Also competing for Stanford was John Martin, who placed fifth on the pommel horse. Martin had scores of 13.500 and 14.350 to be one of the top athletes on that apparatus.

In the prelims, Nicholas Noone competed on select events with some solid results. Noone was the top finisher in his session on parallel bars, earning a season-best score of 14.350. Noone also competed on the still rings, scoring 13.350, which was tied for fifth in his morning session.

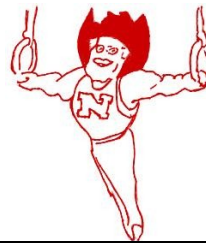
**UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA**

The trio of Golden Bears present at the Las Vegas Sports Center for the Winter Cup Challenge closed qualifier competition on Thursday afternoon and into the evening. Donothan Bailey, Glen Ishino and Steven Lacombe all advanced to the finals on Saturday.

In the first session, Lacombe finished 18th overall of 32 competitors, participating in three events. The highlight of the sophomore's Thursday efforts were the still rings, on which he took first in his group with a 14.20. His 13.550 on floor was good for 10th place in his session while his 15.00 on vault placed him fifth.

Ishino, who petitioned for placement on the 2010 national team despite not competing at the Winter Cup, finished third in his session's all-round with an 86.90. His best event was pommel horse, on which he took second with a 14.90. Parallel bars were no dark spot for the junior as he tied for third (15.35). Of the six events, he finished in the top 10 on four of them, notching a sixth-place score of 15.15 on vault and tying for ninth (13.90) on rings.

Ishino was later named to the National Team although he was unable to participate in the final round of competition due to an injury.

Bailey finished 15th in session two, competing on all six events and scoring a collective 81.70. His best finish was sixth on rings with a 14.15. Rounding out his top events, Bailey scored 14.60 for eighth on parallel bars. He tied for ninth with a 13.90 on horizontal bar.

In the final round of competition: Bailey: 14th AA (163.30), 6th PH (27.50), 6th SR (27.90), 14th PB (27.85), 28th FX (27.15), 28th V (28.35), 26th HB (24.80); Lacombe: 8th SR (27.65), 29th FX (26.80), 16th V (29.85).

### UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA

Senior All-American Anthony Ingrelli headlined a group of four Huskers who competed this past weekend at the Winter Cup Challenge in Las Vegas.

The event, which is hosted by USA Gymnastics, features many of the nation's top collegiate gymnasts as they look to earn a spot on the U.S. Senior National Team. Joining Ingrelli in Las Vegas was freshman Wyatt Aycock, CJ Schaaf, and Eric Schryver.

Ingrelli vied for a spot on still rings, while Aycock, Schaaf, and Schryver competed in the all-around.

Although none of these four qualified for the final round of competition Ingrelli placed 16th on the SR (13.85), Aycock placed 47th in the AA (76.30, Schryver placed 48th in the AA

(76.25) and Schaaf placed 52nd in the AA (75.35).

### AIR FORCE ACADEMY

Backed by three top-four finishes and two career-best scores, sophomore Tory Brown paced members of Air Force during the preliminary round in their session of competition at the 2011 Winter Cup Challenge today (Feb. 3) in Las Vegas, Nev. Brown, senior Nash Mills and sophomore James Okamoto all accounted for at least one top-10 finish during the morning session.

Brown's best finish of the day came on the high bar, where he placed third behind a career-best score of 13.65. He also added fourth-place scores on the vault (15.10) and parallel bars (career-best 13.75), while tying for 16th on the floor exercise (12.65). His high bar mark is a personal improvement by .25 and the 14th-best high bar score in Academy history, while his parallel bars tally is a .20 improvement and ranked 18th on the program's all-time record book.

Competing in five of the six events, Mills picked up a pair of seventh-place finishes. The senior team captain scored a 13.30 to take seventh on the still rings, while earning the same placement on the high bar with a score of 12.95. Mills narrowly missed a top-10 finish on the vault, as he tied for 11th on the apparatus with a score of 14.00. Mills rounded out his day with scores of 11.00 on the parallel bars (17th-tie) and 12.60 on the floor exercise (18th).

Okamoto made his debut at the prestigious Winter Cup Challenge, scoring a 12.20 on the pommel horse to tie for ninth.

Unfortunately none of these scores were high enough to advance any of the Falcon gymnasts to the final round of competition.

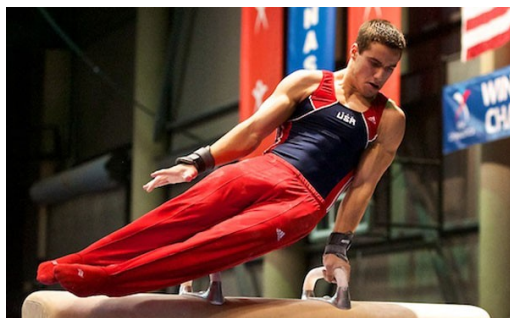

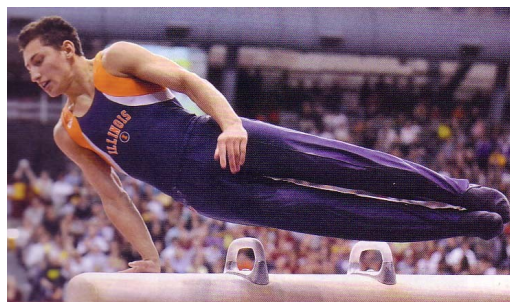
