UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

After suffering a tough road loss to Illinois two weeks ago, the top-ranked Oklahoma men's gymnastics team got right back to business by taking down No. 7 California and No. 5 Stanford at Sunday's tri-meet in Berkeley, Calif.

The Sooners (8-1, 3-0 MPSF) boasted a 351.600 total to top California's 349.400 and Stanford's 343.700.

Oklahoma competes in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) for men's gymnastics, a hybrid conference that also features Air Force, California and Stanford, making the Sooners win over the pair of west coast schools even more important.

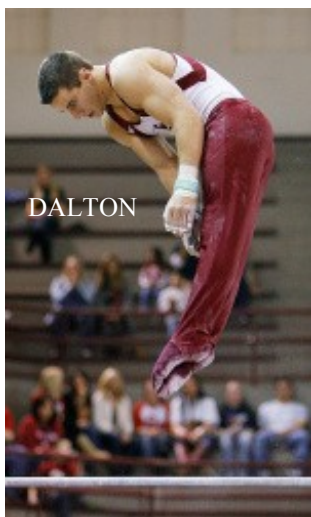

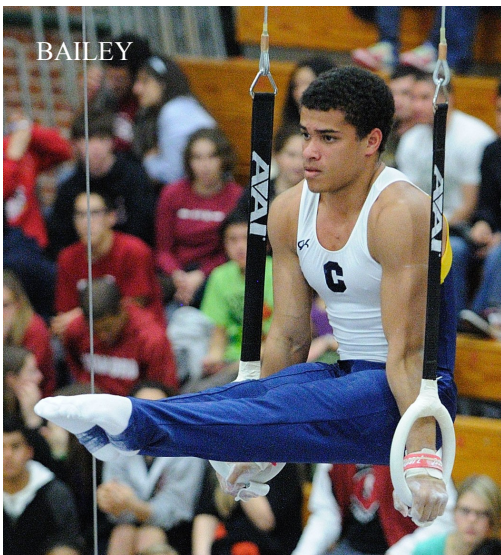

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

California won pommel horse, vault, parallel bars and high bar but narrowly lost to the No. 1 team in the country in Oklahoma on Sunday afternoon. The Golden Bears finished second with 349.400 points to the Sooners' 351.600, but bested Stanford's 343.700.

Glen Ishino won pommel horse, notching a 15.700. Donothan Bailey won parallel bars while Jacob Jizrawi took home the high bar title. Bailey earned his first all-around title of the 2012 campaign at 87.30.

In Floor Exercise Donothan Bailey was Cal's highest finished, taking seventh with a 14.300. Daniel Culpepper was 10th (14.100), Jeffrey Langenstein and Dennis Mannhart tied with Cameron Foreman for 12th (13.800).

The Bears really took a back seat on the Rings as Jean Monteclaro was seventh amongst all competitors and first on the Cal squad with a 14.800. Steven Lacombe was eighth with a 14.600. Mannhart and Bailey tied for 10th (14.400). Langenstein earned a 13.900 for 12th place.

Making up for FX Glen Ishino was first on the Pommel Horse with a 15.700. Bailey was next amongst the Bears with a 14.500 for sixth. Just behind him was Mannhart, who tied for seventh with a 14.400.

In the Vault event Steven Lacombe cracked the medal stand with a 15.00 for third place.

Langenstein narrowly missed the top-three, finishing in a three-way tie for fourth with a 14.900. Bailey tied for seventh (14.800), Monteclaro was 11th (14.500).

On the Parallel Bars the Bears took home first, second and third place with Bailey winning it all (15.000) while Jimmy Kerry and Mannhart tied for second (14.400).

Jacob Jizrawi won the High Bar event with a 15.300 with Mannhart nipping at his heels with a 15.200. Nic Blair had his best performance of the day, taking fifth with a 14.700. Bailey tied for 10th (14.300).

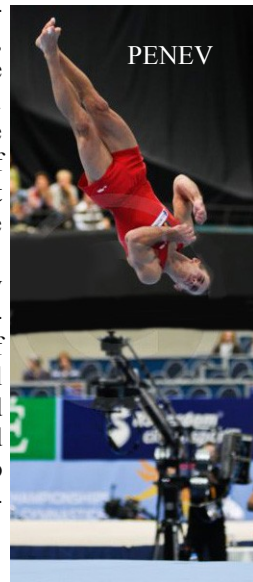
STANFORD UNIVERSITY

No. 5 Stanford compiled a team score of 343.700 to finish behind No. 1 Oklahoma (351.600) and No. 7 California (349.400) Sunday afternoon at Haas Pavilion. The meet marked the first time the Cardinal competed against Oklahoma this year and evened the season series with the Golden Bears at 2-2.

Stanford was in second place after two events, trailing Oklahoma by 4.900 points. Cale Robinson placed fifth on floor exercise with a score of 14.400. Jordan Nolf (15.300) captured the still rings title with James Fosco (14.900) finishing tied for fifth.

The Cardinal struggled on pommel horse, falling into third place after three events. Chris Turner led the team with a score of 14.900 in his first competition of the season.

Turner and Penev led the team on parallel bars with scores of 14.200 and Paul Hichwa (14.800) and Penev (14.700) scored well on high bar to complete the competition.

The ASU Sun Devils captured one of its career highlights with its Feb. 10, 2012 victory over visiting College of William and Mary.

The Sun Devils won by the narrowest margin possible 325.00 to 324.50 and were led by Lee Wilkerson who placed 2nd in the AA (80.80), 4th in FX (13.50), 2nd in V (14.30), 3rd on HB (13.90) and Alex Gaudaur who placed 3rd in the AA (80.10), 3rd on Rings (14.00) 5th on PB (13.60) and 1st on HB (14.40).
