Gymnast of the Week

Sharaya Musser, Penn State

- Recorded three first-place finishes and one third-place effort en route to the all-around title (39.525) in Penn State's meet with Iowa, No. 22 Pittsburgh and Rutgers
- Won the all-around title and placed first on the vault (9.875), bars (9.875) and balance beam (9.925) and third in the floor exercise (9.850)
- Led the Nittany Lions to a first-place team finish in the guad meet

Sarah Miller, Ohio State

- Tied her career-best score (9.950) for first place on the balance beam in No. 19 Ohio State's meet against No. 6 Nebraska
- Also tied for first on the vault (9.925) and in the floor exercise (9.900)

- Finished first in the all-around (39.450) and placed in the top 10 in every event to help No. 12 Minnesota win its quad meet against No. 1 Michigan, No. 20 Central Michigan and lowa State

Taylor Spears, Oklahoma

Spears tied for the all-around title at the Metroplex Challenge, a meet featuring No. 7 LSU, No. 9 Georgia and No. 16 Oregon State. Led by a season-high bars score of 9.875 and the second-best score on beam of any gymnast on the night (9.875), Spears won her third all-around title in four meets this year. The junior is currently No. 7 in the nation with a 39.413 all-around average, second-best among competitors with at least four all-around scores or more this season.

Specialist of the Week

Laura Albright, Oklahoma

Albright totaled a season high and tied a career high with a 9.9 on floor at the Metroplex Challenge. Leading off the rotation for the No. 2 Sooners, Albright scored a team high under pressure, with the Sooners needing a 49.100 or higher going into floor in order to win the Challenge. Performing on podium for the first time this season, Albright set the Sooners up for the win with the second-highest score on floor of the night among some of the country's best competition.

Newcomer of the Week
Lauren Alexander, Oklahoma

Alexander received a 9.975 on beam at the Metroplex Challenge, the highest score earned on beam by any gymnast in the country this season. The mark was the highest of any gymnast on any apparatus at the Challenge and the highest score by a Sooner this season. Alexander was given a 9.95 by one judge and a perfect 10.0 by another. The sophomore is competing for the first time in her career this season. After suffering two ACL injuries her junior year of high school, Alexander was forced to sit out her senior season. She joined the Sooners in fall 2011, but her injury forced her to quit before the 2012 season began. After sitting out the season, Alexander made it back on the roster this fall.
