Her all-around, third in school history, helped the Aggies compile an MPSF record total 196.425. Her floor routine, tied for fourth in school history and the highest by any MPSF gymnast in any event his season, contributed toward a 49.425 — tying another UC Davis record and No. 2 in the MPSF all-time. Shumaker's 9.80 on uneven bars helped the Aggies compile a 49.225, surpassing a school record set in March of 1999, and ranking third in conference history.

San Jose State senior Julia Greer (San Diego, CA) tied for the title on floor with a season-high 9.900 against No. 25 Southern Utah. She helped lead her team to a season-best 49.200 on the apparatus. Greer also won her fourth beam title of the season with a 9.850, and added a 9.650 on vault. The Spartans earned a season-best 195.775, the third-highest team score in program history and fifth-highest in MPSF history. Greer owns an MPSF-High three specialist awards this year.

Additionally, Courtney tied for fourth on beam (9.85) and seventh on bars (9.825).

It marked Jordan's third all-around title of the season and the fifth of her career. Her all-around score also tied for the best in the conference in this week's meets. Jordan captured the vault title with a 9.925, her first vault crown of the season and only the second of her career. She also recorded a career-high 9.925 on floor to help LSU break the school record for highest floor total with a 49.700. Jordan added a 9.90 on bars as the Tigers finished with a 49.500, the sixth-highest bars total in LSU history.

Specialist of the Week Lindsey Cheek, Georgia

Lindsey Cheek helped Georgia score a season-high 197.650 against Arkansas by placing first on vault, bars and beam, including career-highs on vault and beam. Cheek set a new career-high with a 9.975 on vault, then she scored a 9.95 on bars to tie for first. The Watkinsville, Ga., native was awarded 10s by two judges – one on vault and one on bars. Cheek added another first place finish on beam with a 9.95. Cheek, who now owns 15 individual event titles this season, is ranked third nationally on bars, fifth on beam and ninth on vault.

Claire Boyce, Florida

Boyce has been a part of every Gator beam and floor lineup in 2014. At then No. 4 Alabama, Boyce upped her collegiate beam best to 9.925 to earn a share of the event title. It was her first collegiate event title. She also turned in a 9.85 on floor. It was her second consecutive meet with a collegiate-best on beam as she equaled her then best of 9.90 against LSU on Feb. 21. Fourteen of her 16 routines this season have been scored 9.80 or above, including collegiate bests of 9.925 on beam and 9.875 on floor. In the Feb. 24 national rankings, Boyce held the No. T9 spot in beam – the only freshman among the nation's top 10 beam standings.
