












UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

The Oklahoma Sooners captured their fourth consecutive MPSF Championship on rings, notching a 15.550 to stay perfect on Saturday evening in by scoring a 447.400. Stanford took second with a mark of 437.150, California finished third (432.700) and Air Force came in fourth (425.150).

Michael Reid posted the highest score of the meet on pommel horse with a 15.750. Michael Squires won his eighth rings title in as many meets this season with a 15.550. Danny Berardini claimed the high bar championship with a 15.400 and Allan Bower and Kanji Oyama split the vault title with a matching 15.400.

Bower took second in the all-around competition with a score of 88.800.



On the floor exercise. Oklahoma was paced by Dowdy with a 15.450. Kani Oyama nearly matched Dowdy by scoring a 15.350. Other quality routines were turned in by Bower (15.000) and Justus (14.950).

Reid was masterful on the pommel horse to win the event title with a 15.750. Sergey Resnick added a 14.850 and Alec Robin and

Bower each produced a 14.650.

Squires was excellent as usual, on the the event this season.

The Crimson and Cream posted a score of 75.800 on vault, setting a program record on the apparatus. Josh Yee and Thao Hoang got Oklahoma off to a good start with a 14.950 and 15.000 respectively. Todd Dowdy followed with a 15.050 before Bower and Oyama posted back-to-back scores of 15.400 to send the team into an uproar. The Sooners recorded sticks on four of the five vaults.

The Sooners notched three scores above 15 on the parallel bars, their fifth event of the night. Bower led the way with a 15.250 followed by scores of 15.100 from Berardini and Resnick.

Oklahoma capped off the evening with the high bar to secure the MPSF title. After three scores between 14.550 and 14.950, Berardini captured the team's fourth event title with a 15.400 on the apparatus after a wonderful set. Will Clement then put the exclamation mark on the evening with a 15.050 to give OU it's fourth conference crown in as many years.

STANFORD UNIVERSITY

Akash Modi delivered a season-best performance in the all-around and claimed three event titles to lead No. 2 Stanford to its fourth consecutive second-place finish at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Championships Saturday evening.

The Cardinal scored 437.150 to place behind No. 1 Oklahoma (447.400) and ahead of No. 7 California (432.700) and No. 10 Air scores of 14.500 and 14.350, respectively. Force (425.150).

Modi was named the MPSF Gymnast of the Year for the second consecutive season at the conclusion of the meet. He showcased why he deserved the honor throughout the conference championships, earning MPSF titles in the all -around (90.400), parallel bars (15.650) and floor (15.500). Modi also recorded top-10 finishes on vault (3rd, 15.350), rings (7th, 14.650), high bar (8th, 14.750) and pommel horse (10th, 14.500).



Dennis Zaremski had a great showing, registering second-place finishes on parallel bars (15.350) and rings (14.900). He score on parallel bars is a season best.

Brian Knott led the Cardinal on pommel horse with a 15.050 to place third. He added a sixth-place finish on parallel bars (15.000) and a ninth-place result on high bar (14.700).

Michael Levy tied for fifth on floor with a season-best 15.350 and produced a 14.650 on rings to tie for seventh.

Sean Senters placed fourth on vault with a 15.200 and had a nice showing on floor with a 14.950.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

The California Golden Bears placed third at the MPSF Championships with a team total of Kevin Wolting (87.750) and Ryan Patterson (86.900) placed third and fourth, respectively in the all-around competition.

The Bears opened the evening on pommel horse, and they totaled just 69.300. Despite the slow start, Takahiro Kawada closed the rotation on a high note with a 14.850.

Kyle Zemeir's 14.750 routine, which placed him fifth overall on the rings. Patterson and Wolting also showed well on rings, posting

The Golden Bears picked up some steam on

14.900. Patterson was second for the Bears with a 14.700, while Kevin Ko was also impressive with a 14.400.



Zemeir led the team on parallel bars, garnering a score of 14.650. All five competitors scored 14.100 or higher, including freshman Yordan Aleksandrov's 14.450.

Wolting's 15.250 routine anchored the high bar rotation, which earned him a second place finish on the event. Patterson was very strong as well, notching a score of 14.900.

The Bears saved their best for last on floor exercise, posting a program-record 75.200 to finish the meet. All five Golden Bears were 14.600 or better, and three finished with a 15.000 or better. Patterson set a new careerbest with a 15.450 (tied for second). Additionally, Wolting garnered a score of 15.400, while Zemeir posted a 15.000.

AIR FORCE ACADEMY

Highlighted by top-three finishes from freshman Arinn Wade and sophomore Chase Cannon, the 10th-ranked Air Force men's

gymnastics team wrapped up its home season with a fourth-place finish at the 2015 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Championships.

Wade was the runner-up on the pommel horse and finished Cannon third on the high bar. Wade tallied a



score of 15.400 while Cannon recorded the second-highest score in Air Force history (15.200) to earn the program's first top-three finish on the high bar.

Tim Wang added a seventh-place score of 14.700 on the pommel horse.

The Falcons accounted for top-10 finishes on three additional events. Aaron Nubine tallied a score of 15.350 to tie for fifth on the floor exercise, while Greg Chaput finished


vault, where Wolting led the way with a eighth on the parallel bars (season-best 14.800) and Denis Aurelius finished ninth on the still rings (14.600).

> In addition to his third-place finish on the high bar, Cannon also shared the team lead on the vault, as he and Josh Pyne recorded matching marks of 14.500 to tie for 12th in the overall standings. That score is a seasonbest for Cannon, who competed in just his fifth vault of the year.

> In his first collegiate all-around, Josh Ramos scored an 83.900 to finish sixth in the standings. That mark, which included his first still rings routine since the initial meet of his freshman year, is the eighth-highest allaround total in program history.


