**ATHLETE SELECTION PROCEDURES**  
**2024 OLYMPIC GAMES**  
**MEN'S ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS**  
**February 16 , 2024**  
**Amended March 5, 2024**

**1. SELECTION SYSTEM**

1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the Team:

1.1.0. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the time of selection.

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Games.

1.1.1. Minimum International Olympic Committee (IOC) standards for participation:

Any competitor in the Olympic Games must be a national of the country of the National Olympic Committee (NOC) which is entering such competitor. For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Olympic Charter (Rule 41).

1.1.2. Minimum International Federation (IF) standards for participation (if any):

- Athlete must be a minimum of 18 years of age by December 31, 2024.
- Athlete must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form and should have a FIG License that is valid until the end of the event.
- Athlete must not have competed as a Junior athlete in a FIG sanctioned competition in 2024.

1.1.3. Other requirements:

- Athletes must be a member of the U.S. Men's National Team and be in good standing with USA Gymnastics at the time of selection.

- Athlete must successfully complete all Games Registration requirements by stated deadline.
- Any athlete age 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current [USOPC Background Check Policy](#).
- Any athlete age 18 or older as of the Closing Ceremony will be required to remain current with the U.S. Center for SafeSport’s education and training requirements in accordance with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#).

1.2. Tryout Events:

1.2.1. Event names, dates and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process:

- a. 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships – May 30-June 2 in Fort Worth, TX
- b. 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials – June 27-30 in Minneapolis, MN

1.2.2. Describe how athletes qualify for the events listed in 1.2.1.:

- a. Athletes may qualify to the Senior session of the 2024 U.S. Championships through the following methods:
  - By being named to the Senior National Team (including Senior Development Team) from either of the previous two National Team selection events (2023 U.S. Championships & 2024 Winter Cup).
  - By being one of the next five (5) ranked athletes in the [Men’s Point Program](#) final results at the 2024 Winter Cup, who are not already qualified to U.S. Championships.
  - Excluding athletes already qualified to the U.S. Championships, the top six (6) ranked athletes in the all-around at the 2024 NCAA Championships will qualify to U.S. Championships provided that they finish within the top 10 all-around at the 2024 NCAA Championships.
  - By being one of the top three (3) ranked 18 or 19 year old Level 10 JE athletes in the all-around final results from 2024 Men’s Development National Championships.
  - By Men’s Program Committee approved petition (see 1.4.4.a below).
- b. Athletes may qualify to the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials through the following methods:
  - By being named to the Senior National Team (including Senior Development Team) following the 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships.

- By ~~Men's Program~~ Senior Selection Committee approved petition (see 1.4.4.b below).

1.3. Step-by-step description of the selection process for these Games (include maximum Team size):

1.3.1. A maximum of five (5) athletes will be named to the Olympic Games Team. Two (2) traveling replacement athletes and up to three (3) non-traveling replacement athletes will also be named. Athletes will be named to the Team and as replacement athletes by the Senior Selection Committee (SSC) from the pool of competitors at the 2024 Olympic Team Trials or any petitioned athletes.

1.3.2. The Senior Selection Committee (SSC) will name the 2024 Olympic Games Team through the following method:

a. Using final results from the 2024 Olympic Team Trials (2 days combined), the top all-around athlete will automatically qualify to the Olympic Team as long as they also place within the top three (3) on at least three (3) of the individual apparatus. The remaining team members and replacement athletes will be determined by the process described in 1.3.2.b. Should the top all-around athlete not place in the top three (3) on at least three (3) different apparatus, then that athlete may be selected through the process in 1.3.2.b.

b. The remaining Olympic Games team members will be selected by the Senior Selection Committee using the following team-scoring scenarios and discretionary criteria:

- Team-scoring scenarios will be created to determine the highest scoring potential for the team utilizing both a 5-4-3 (Qualifications) and 5-3-3 (Team Final) team competition format. Placings within each of the team-scoring scenarios as well as scoring differential between those scenarios will be evaluated. The SSC will review the top five (5) team-scoring scenarios in each set of final results in prioritized order below. Should an athlete earn the automatic spot on the Olympic Team as described in 1.3.2.a, then only the top five (5) team-scoring scenarios, which include that athlete, will be evaluated from each set:
  - Set 1 will include the top three (3) scores from the final results for each athlete across four (4) days of competition at the 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships (2 days combined) and the 2024 Olympic Team Trials (2 days combined).
  - Set 2 will include all four (4) scores from the final results for each athlete across four (4) days of competition at the 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships (2 days combined) and the 2024 Olympic Team Trials (2 days combined).

- In the event a top five (5) team-scoring scenario in a data set includes a team that is only able to compete three athletes (i.e. the other two athletes do not compete in a particular apparatus) in the Team Preliminary (Qualifications) competition on any apparatus, that team will not be considered and will be removed from team scoring scenario rankings unless they are at least 0.5 better than the next highest team-scoring scenario in that data set. If necessary, remaining scenarios will be ranked without teams that have been removed, to establish the top five (5).
- If, once the top five (5) team-scoring scenarios are established for each data set, the top team scoring scenario from each of the data sets listed above are made up of the exact same athletes, then that team will be named as the 2024 Olympic Team.
- If, once the top five (5) team-scoring scenarios are established for each data set, the top team-scoring scenario from each of the data sets listed above (which includes different athletes) are separated by more than two (2) points of each other, then the team with the higher total score from those two teams will be named as the 2024 Olympic Team.
- If, once the top five (5) team-scoring scenarios are established for each data set, the top team-scoring scenario from each of the data sets listed above (which includes different athletes) are within two (2) points of each other (including ties), then additional Discretionary Criteria will be considered, which includes the following, in no priority order:
  - Team-scoring scenarios from final results at the 2024 Olympic Team Trials only (2 days combined).
  - Total Team Difficulty scores from each team-scoring scenario – the top 4 (qualifications) or 3 (team final) D-Scores for each athlete across their competitive events.
  - Final results from each day of the Selection Events listed in Section 1.2.1, including Difficulty scores, Execution scores, Final scores and overall consistency across the 2024 U.S. Championships and 2024 Olympic Team Trials for each athlete.
  - Maximizing individual medal potential– the athlete has internationally competitive Difficulty, Execution and Final scores that compare with finalists from previous FIG international events within the years 2021-2024, including but not limited to the following:
    - World Championships
    - FIG World Cups & Challenge Cups
    - Continental Championships
    - Major Games (Olympic Games, Asian Games, Pan American Games, Commonwealth Games, etc.)

- International experience– the athlete has demonstrated performance in international competition within the years 2021-2024, that would prepare them for the Olympic Games.
- c. The two (2) traveling replacement athletes and the up to three (3) non-traveling replacement athletes will be determined by the SSC using the criteria listed in 1.3.2.b.
- d. The five (5) members of the Olympic Team and all replacement athletes will be named following the end of the Men’s competition at the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials.

#### 1.4. Petition Procedures

- 1.4.1. Notwithstanding the process identified above, USA Gymnastics recognizes that extraordinary and unforeseen circumstances may occur which would cause an athlete otherwise deserving of a spot on the 2024 Olympic Games Team because of their previous competition results to be unable to participate in one or more steps in the selection process.
- 1.4.2. Petition Rights: USA Gymnastics will allow athletes, with a specific injury, illness or unusual circumstance, which prohibits the athlete from participating in the competitive process, to petition USA Gymnastics for the right to:
  - a. Participate in the 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships as determined by the Men’s Program Committee.
  - b. Participate in the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials as determined by the Men’s Senior Selection Committee.
  - c. Be selected to the 2024 Olympic Games Team as determined by the Men’s Senior Selection Committee.
- 1.4.3. Only athletes who meet the following criteria may submit a petition:
  - a. A petition to enter the Senior session of the 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships may be submitted by any age-eligible athlete.
  - b. A petition to enter the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials may only be submitted by an athlete who is or has been a member of the Senior National Team (including Senior Development Team) in the years 2021, 2022, 2023 or 2024.
  - c. A petition directly on to the 2024 Olympic Games Team may only be submitted by a member of the Olympic or World Championship Team in the years 2021 (includes Tokyo Olympics), 2022, or 2023. In addition, the athlete must have competed in any capacity in at least one day of competition at either of the Selection Events listed in Section 1.2.1.
- 1.4.4. Petition Process:

- a. Petitions to the 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships must follow the process below:
- Petitions are due to the Men’s Program Committee Chairman via email by May 13, 2024.
  - All submitted petitions must include the following:
    - Petition Form located here:

    - Medical report/letter by an examining physician subject to verification by USAG medical staff;
    - Athlete’s return to play plan/timeline; or
    - Proof of medical clearance to participate subject to verification by USAG medical staff.
  - Petitions are reviewed by the Men’s Program Committee based on the following factors:
    - Number of available competitive spots at the competition – approximately 48 athletes may compete in the Senior session at the 2024 U.S. Championships.
    - Medical clearance and return to play timeline.
    - Current or previous National Team status.
    - Strength of previous competition results - the petitioned athlete has shown past results at domestic Championship events or FIG international events assigned by USAG (within the years 2021-2024) that are competitive with already qualified athletes.
- b. Petitions to the 2024 Olympic Team Trials must follow the process below:
- Petitions are due to the Men’s Senior Selection Committee Chairman via email prior to completion of the final session at the 2024 U.S. Gymnastics Championships. In the event an athlete is injured during competition and is unable to submit the requirements below before the end of competition, the coach must notify the SSC Chair (verbally or by email) that a petition will be submitted, and the required documentation will be submitted as soon as possible (but not more than 24 hours) following the end of competition.
  - All submitted petitions must include the following:
    - Petition Form located here:

    - Medical report/letter by an examining physician subject to verification by USAG medical staff;
    - Athlete’s return to play plan/timeline; or
    - Proof of medical clearance to participate subject to verification by USAG medical staff.

- Petitions are reviewed by the Men’s Senior Selection Committee based on the following factors:
    - Medical clearance and return to play timeline.
    - Current or previous National Team status.
    - Strength of previous competition results - the petitioned athlete has shown past results at domestic Championship events or FIG international events assigned by USAG (within the years 2021-2024) that are competitive with already qualified athletes.
- c. Petitions directly on to the 2024 Olympic Games Team must follow the process below:
- Petitions are due to the Senior Selection Committee Chairman via email prior to the conclusion of the 2024 Olympic Team Trials.
  - All petitions must include the following:
    - Petition form to be completed: <https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/Men/Rules/Rules%20and%20Policies/injury-petition.pdf>
    - Medical report/letter by an examining physician subject to verification by USAG medical staff;
    - Athlete’s return to play plan/timeline; or
    - Proof of medical clearance to participate subject to verification by USAG medical staff.
    - Estimated date for show of readiness (The deadline for a show of readiness is **July 1, 2024**).
    - For petitions directly on to the 2024 Olympic Games Team, the SSC will consider the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 1.3.2.b using the athlete’s two (2) most recent competition results from domestic Championship events (Winter Cup, US Championships or Olympic Trials) and assigned FIG international events within the calendar years 2023 and 2024.
    - The athlete will be required to show readiness before the final deadline to submit Olympic Team members to the USOPC: within 24 hours of the conclusion of USAG’s respective competitions – Olympic Trials (Artistic) OR no later than 17:00/5:00 pm, July 2, 2024, whichever comes first. If time permits, this will include evaluation from the U.S. Championship judging panels.
      - A show of readiness will require the athlete to perform their required routines with full difficulty across one or two competition days. They must perform their routines at a level that is competitive with the other team members, shows consistency and supports their selection to the Team.

## 2. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION (if applicable)

2.1. Rationale for utilizing discretionary selection (if any):

The sport of gymnastics is a subjectively judged sport. The first objective for the Men's Artistic Team is to achieve the highest possible team score in order to win the Team competition. The secondary objective is to maximize individual medal potential either through all-around or individual event performances. Assessments must be performed in order to identify an athlete's ability to contribute to the highest possible team score as well as their medal potential. Multiple factors will play a role when determining the best combination of athletes to achieve the stated objectives.

2.2. Define the discretionary criteria to be used (if any):

2.3. Name of the committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections, or other decisions/recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process, along with a complete list of the members' titles:

The Men's Senior Selection Committee will be made up of the following members:

- Senior Coach Representative
- Senior Coach Representative
- Athlete Representative
- Athlete Representative
- High Performance Director
- Men's Program Vice President (voice, no vote)
- Independent Observer (process voice, no vote). An independent observer will attend meetings as required by Article 9 of the [USA Gymnastics Bylaws](#). The independent observer will be appointed from the list of approved independent observers previously voted on by the USA Gymnastics Board of Directors.

2.3.1. Process that will be used to identify and handle any potential conflicts of interest involving a member of the committee:

All members of the selection committee must comply with the USA Gymnastics [Conflict of Interest policy](#), which shall include completing and submitting a disclosure form for review by the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee prior to convening the committee.

Any member of the Selection Committee per Section 2.3 who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee prior to the start of the selection process and/or recuse him/herself from the review process



and/or voting. If a conflict exists, the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse him/herself from participating in discussions and/or voting). For example, if it is determined that a committee member must recuse him/herself from voting, the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee may still determine that a committee member who has relevant and necessary information with respect to athlete performance may, if requested by the Selection Committee, provide such information to the committee so long as such information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and so long as the committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision. The committee member must not otherwise influence other members of the committee in the selection process.

Additionally, any person (including any potentially impacted athlete or coach of a potentially impacted athlete) with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the potential conflict of interest to the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee. Reports may be made anonymously. No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with USA Gymnastics' Selection Committee charter.

### **3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES**

- 3.1. Prior to submitting athlete entries by name to the USOPC, the NGB has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USA Gymnastics may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:

- 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the USA Gymnastics President and CEO.
- 3.1.2. Injury or illness which inhibits peak performance which shall be determined by an examining physician verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.

- 3.1.4. Violation of the USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct ([https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/code\\_ethical\\_conduct.pdf](https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/code_ethical_conduct.pdf)), National Team Agreement or Program Manual ([https://usagym.org/pages/men/pages/selection\\_procedures.html](https://usagym.org/pages/men/pages/selection_procedures.html))
- 3.1.5. Non-compliance with the eligibility requirements listed in Section 1.1.
- 3.1.6. If NGB has any other specific reason for removal, list it here.

Removal may only occur by action of the President and CEO of USA Gymnastics and the Men’s Athlete Selection Representative (or another Athlete Representative appointed by the USA Gymnastics Athletes’ Council in the case of a conflict of interest) after consultation with the Selection Committee, and an interview with the athlete and his coach. An athlete who is removed from the 2024 Olympic Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per [USA Gymnastics Grievance policy](#) and the [USOPC Bylaws](#) (Section 9).

- 3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted to the USOPC, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable NGB Code of Conduct, the USOPC’s Delegation Conduct Requirements apply, contained in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms. The USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and made available during the Games registration process; the USOPC’s Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the Delegation Terms. See “Delegation Events” at [Team USA website](#) for more information.
- 3.3. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, APC, WADA, IF, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as well as the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and USA Gymnastics’ Safety & Response policies, as applicable.

#### **4. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES**

- 4.1. Describe the selection and approval process for determining replacement athlete(s) should a vacancy occur:
  - 4.1.1. Prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

Should a Team athlete need to be replaced, the Senior Selection Committee will name the replacement from the pool of identified replacement athletes using the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 1.3.2.b.

- 4.1.2. After submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

Should a Team athlete need to be replaced prior to the Team's departure for France, the Senior Selection Committee will name the replacement from the pool of identified replacement athletes using the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 1.3.2.b. Should a Team athlete need to be replaced after the Team's departure for France, then the High Performance Director, in consultation with Team coaches and Vice President for Men's Program will be responsible for naming the replacement athlete using the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 1.3.2.b.

## 5. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

- 5.1. USA Gymnastics will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process for six months past the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Games.
- 5.2. A Senior Selection Committee (SSC) report signed by the Independent Observer, outlining the work and decisions of the SSC, will be made available for distribution to all athletes and coaches who participated in the Selection Events at least 14 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, unless the Selection Committee meeting occurs less than 30 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, in which case the minutes will be published within a reasonable timeframe after the Selection Committee meeting under the circumstances. The report will be made public on the USA Gymnastics website. USA Gymnastics retains the sole discretion to determine the contents and timing of the report.

## 6. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

In addition to the USOPC Delegation Conduct Requirements, the following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Olympic Games (include as attachments or provide links) and can be found on the [USA Gymnastics website](#):

## 7. PUBLICITY/DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEDURES

The USOPC approved Selection Procedures (complete and unaltered) will be posted/published by USA Gymnastics in the following public location(s):

These procedures will be posted as soon as possible, but not more than five business days following notice of approval by the USOPC.

## **8. DATE OF NOMINATION**

Nomination of athletes, including replacements, will be announced to all athletes and submitted to the USOPC within 24 hours of the conclusion of USAG's respective competitions – Olympic Trials (Artistic) OR no later than 17:00/5:00 pm, July 2, 2024, whichever comes first.

## **9. MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION**

Specify the location, schedule and duration of mandatory training and/or competition:

July 19-22, 2024: 2024 Olympic Team Camp in Arques, France

## **10. ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS**

Athletes must adhere to all IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, APC, WADA, IF, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, APC, WADA, IF, USADA and USOPC rules, as applicable.

Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, APC, as applicable, and/or FIG rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Gymnastics. However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions, pursuant to their resubmission to the USOPC.

**14. ATHLETE OMBUDS OFFICE**

The Athlete Ombuds Office provides cost-free, independent and confidential advice regarding athlete rights, grievance procedures and any other related guidance pertaining to selection procedures and can assist in mediating disputes between athletes and their NGB/PSO.





If the Athlete Representative reads and does not agree with the Athlete Selection Procedures being submitted by the NGB/PSO, he/she may submit those reasons in writing to his/her USOPC Sport Performance Team.

\* If, for some reason, a sport does not have an elected USOPC AAC Representative, the NGB/PSO must designate an athlete from that sport to review and sign the Selection Procedures.
