

Acrobatic Gymnastics Selection Procedures 2026-2027 Senior National Team (SNT)

I. Overview

The process for qualification/selection to the 2026-2027 Acrobatic Gymnastics National Team is a combination of the results from 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships and selection criteria outlined (II).

A. QUALIFICATION:

Athletes will be named to the SNT in one of the following ways:

- i. Automatically qualify from the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships per Section II.A.
- ii. Be selected using the discretionary criteria based on performances at the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships as defined in Section II.B
- iii. Through a successfully approved petition onto SNT through the process set forth in Section III.
- iv. The Acrobatic Gymnastics Selection Committee (SC) reserves the right to select additional pair/groups for SNT at selection events during the 2026-2027 competitive season. The criteria for selection are outlined in Section II.A and Section II.B.

B. ELIGIBILITY:

- i. Only United States citizens may be named to SNT.
- ii. All athletes in the pair/group must meet FIG Senior age criteria by 2028 (be at least 15 years of age by the end of the calendar year 2028).
 - a. For SNT World Cup assignments all athletes in the pair/group must meet FIG Senior age criteria by 2027. (Be at least 15 years of age by the end of the calendar year in 2027)
- iii. Athletes must compete at the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships and follow the selection process outlined, unless petitioning (see Section III).
 - a. USA Gymnastics Championships to be held from June 22-27, 2026 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.
- iv. Athletes must be a member in good standing with USA Gymnastics.
- v. Any athlete aged 18 or older will be required to complete USA Gymnastics' U110: US Center for SafeSport Core Course online training available at <https://usagym.org/pages/education/courses/U110/>.
- vi. Athletes trying out for SNT must compete in the Senior Elite category at the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships to be considered.
- vii. An athlete may not be named to SNT in multiple disciplines (i.e., men's pairs and men's group).

C. SELECTION:

- i. The selection of the pair/groups to SNT will be made by the Acrobatic Gymnastics Selection Committee (SC).
- ii. Selection will be made according to criteria outlined in Section II.
- iii. The selection process will be consistent with the standards outlined in USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest Guide for Athlete Selection.

D. TEAM COMPOSITION:

The composition of SNT may include a maximum of ten (10) pair/groups (Women's Pair, Men's Pair, Mixed Pair, Women's Group, and Men's Group). SC is not obligated to fill all available spots on the SNT team.

- i. Positions on SNT may require ranking. The SC will determine ranking.
- ii. Ranking may be adjusted throughout the competitive season and will be evaluated at selection competitions (i.e. Acro Cup, National Qualifier, USA Gymnastics Championships) or training camps-in closest proximity to the international assignment.
- iii. The SC will work closely with the High-performance Manager to formulate assignments based on a variety of strategic factors (see IV.E.)
- iv. A maximum of one (1) alternate pair/group per event may be identified. Alternates are not members of SNT.

- v. Alternates may be named to the SNT if vacancies become available in team positions. Decision to name alternates to the team will be based upon timing in the season, available international assignments, number of current SNT members, and pair/group's readiness for international competition (as determined by the SC).

II. SELECTION CRITERIA FOR SENIOR NATIONAL TEAM (SNT) WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

A. AUTOMATIC QUALIFICATION TO SNT:

A pair/group will automatically qualify to the 2026-2027 Acrobatic Gymnastics SNT from the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships, if *all* the following criteria is met:

- i. The pair/group must finish in first place in qualifications, semi-finals (if applicable), and finals their respective event.
- ii. The pair/group must earn minimum scores in each routine, in qualifications, semi-finals (if applicable), and finals, as follows:

8.75 Artistry
17.5 Execution

- iii. The pair/group must achieve minimum difficulty value in each routine, in qualifications, semi-finals (if applicable), and finals, as follows:

150 Balance
140 Dynamic
170 Combined

- iv. In the event of a tie, both pair/groups will be named to the SNT.

B. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION CRITERIA FOR SENIOR NATIONAL TEAM (SNT) WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

- i. In addition to automatic qualification to SNT, pair/groups may be added to the SNT based on discretionary evaluation of performances from the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships. Evaluation criteria for selection is outlined below. Note: Additions to SNT via the petition process or 2026/2027 future selection events will use the discretionary criteria below as well. All discretionary criteria are considered equivalent and will be evaluated.

- **Score(s) and ranking(s)** from the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships. Note that any received bonus credit (s) are removed prior to score and rank evaluations.
- **Elements performed:** During elements performed evaluation process, additional consideration will be given to pair/groups that compete all routines at or above the minimum difficulty values listed below at the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships.

- Total exercise difficulty will be compared against the target difficulty outlined below. Target difficulty is the difficulty score before CJP deductions and prior to any bonus credit additions.

- Bonus elements and other high-quality elements successfully performed in competition. High-quality elements defined as showcasing difficulty, creativity, or innovative entrance/exit successfully performed in competition.
- Number of elements in each exercise to reach the total difficulty. Skills are combined when logical and possible to maximize flow of routine and minimize number of skill builds.
- Technical performance of elements including quality of body lines, exceptional amplitude and body shapes in balance and dynamic, and overall control and ease of elements. Individual elements are performed cleanly with limited technical deductions.

- **Artistry and Presentation**

- Performance, Choreography, Musicality, Expression, and Partnership will be considered by the SC (per [FIG Acrobatic Gymnastics Code of Points](#)).
- Intricacy, complexity, and creativity of choreography exhibited in exercises.
- Effective use of music, entries/exits, or other artistry moments that create identity or memorability amongst large competitive divisions.
- Overall sophistication and performance of artistry and choreography will be considered. Routines are expected to be performed with full amplitude, polished timing, smooth transitions with elements, and ease on the floor.

- **International caliber and Overall performance**

- International caliber defined as strength, endurance, flexibility, and grace. Standards commensurate with world-level competitors.
- Posture, presence, and poise entering and exiting the floor and during the performance of the exercise.
- Previous competitive experience in current or past partnerships within the last two (2) years. Pair/group professionalism, and consistency will be taken into consideration.
 - Consistency -Percentage of hit routines at any official international assignment or selection event during the 2024-2026competitive seasons.
 - A hit routine is defined as a routine that does not include a very large deduction (as defined in the [FIG Code of Points](#)) on any single skill within the routine.
- Mental and physical competitive readiness that allows for maximum performance.
 - Demonstrates confidence and consistency in all aspects of training and performance at 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships.
 - Readiness to compete – current health status and physical preparedness of the pair/group.
- Demonstrated professional attitude and ability to positively contribute to the team dynamic and adhering to National Team policies.

III. PETITIONS

Petition Procedures - Notwithstanding the process identified in the preceding sections of these Selection Procedures, USA Gymnastics recognizes that extraordinary circumstances may occur which would cause a pair/group otherwise deserving of a spot on the 2026-2027 National Team, because of their previous competition results, to be unable to participate in one or more steps in that process. For a petition onto the National Team to be considered, it must be submitted in writing to the Acrobatic Gymnastics Program Director and meet the following requirements:

A. Petitioning athletes must have:

- i. Qualified to compete at the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships.
- ii. Registered to compete at the 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships.
- iii. Signed and submitted selection procedures by the deadline.

B. Petitions must be submitted immediately following the pair/group's inability to participate in the selection event and before the conclusion of the selection event.

C. Petitioning athletes MUST submit a video for review. The video should follow the guidelines listed below.

D. Petitions will be considered in the event of an injury, illness, family death, or other extenuating circumstances.

- i. The petition must include the date and nature of the injury and/or illness, family death, or other extenuating circumstance.
- ii. Petitions based upon injury or illness must be accompanied by a physician's statement. The injury or illness is subject to verification by an examining physician subject to verification by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff. Additional documentation may be requested to validate unforeseen circumstances.

E. Due to the interdependent nature of partnerships, a petition must be jointly submitted by all members of the pair/group.

F. Petitions will be considered by the Acrobatic Gymnastics Selection Committee (SC) based on discretionary criteria listed (II.B).

G. Petition Video Guidelines

- i. All competition videos should be from the judge's viewpoint, as close to a normal judge's position as possible.
- ii. Perspective should be from the front center of the floor.
- iii. Recording device set up on table, or on tripod (preferred) slightly above height of table.
- iv. Camera should be a reasonable distance from the floor and athletes, so all partners are visible, yet athletes do not appear too distant in the video.
- v. If possible, all four corners of floor should be visible in the video.
- vi. The video should be HD quality; standard HD (720 or 1080).
- vii. The video should be stable, without shaking or bumps. Use of a tripod is helpful.
- viii. Video should be captured using landscape perspective.
- ix. As much as possible, the camera should remain static. Camera should remain at a steady distance to see all athletes and skills and should only be moved from side-to-side if the entire floor is not visible. The camera should not be moved up and down to capture the routine.
- x. All partners must be visible at all times. This includes for high skills and tosses, as well as when the partners are spread around the floor.
- xi. Video must include the athletes' walk on at the beginning of the exercise, the complete exercise, and the walk off at the end of the exercise.
- xii. Music should be clear and loud enough on the video. Video must consist of all competition routines with all skills, full amount of difficulty, and artistry. Performances must be of the most recent competition or event, ideally within 4 weeks or less of USA Gymnastics Championships. Competition attire is required. Note: Coaches are encouraged to precautionarily take videos of performances leading up to 2026 USA Gymnastics Championships in the event a petition would be required.

IV. TEAM OBLIGATIONS

- A. Pair/groups selected to SNT remain on the team until the 2027 USA Gymnastics Championships or until the partnership/group dissolves whichever comes first.
- B. SNT members must sign all documents in accordance with the USA Gymnastics National Team Handbook and USA Gymnastics National Team Funding and Support Agreement.
- C. SNT athletes are required to attend National Training Camps and strongly encouraged to attend Regional Training Camp opportunities.
- D. SNT athletes must attend a mandatory team meeting on Sunday June 28th. Time and location TBA.
- E. The High-performance Manager with input from the Director of Acrobatics Program will formulate the calendar of events and delegation sizes. The SC will work closely with the High-Performance Manager to formulate assignments based on a variety of strategic factors including, but not limited to: competition directives, competitive readiness of a pair/group, opportunity for international experience, age requirements, size of delegation, competitive history, and/or international success, as well as finals/medal potential.
 - i. Assigned competitions will inherently vary and therefore, the weight of above criterium will vary and will be reflective of strategic goals for each event; and additionally, will take into consideration broader overall National Team competitive season goals.
 - ii. SNT pair/groups may or may not be given an assignment during the 2026-2027 competitive year.
 - iii. Pair/groups who do not accept assignment/s offered may not receive another assignment.
 - iv. Assignments may be determined during training camps (accompanied with video review to SC) in additional to designated selection events.
- F. Athletes may decline an international assignment due to funding.
- G. Pair/groups named to SNT team are required to continue their training (at the same level of intensity, hours of training, and number of days/week) and fully participate in any proof-of-readiness events, or competitions for the remainder of the 2026-2027 competitive season leading up to any SNT international assignments to maintain their level of preparation.
- H. Funding will be in accordance with USA Gymnastics National Team Funding and Support Agreement.
- I. USA warm-ups will be provided to SNT athletes prior to their first international competition assignment as Team USA.
- J. The following documents are required to be adhered to by athletes and coaches as a condition of being named to the 2026-2027 SNT and can be found online at https://usagym.org/pages/acro/pages/acro_selection_procedures.html
 - i. USA Gymnastics Safe Sport Policy
 - ii. USA Gymnastics Code of Ethical Conduct

- iii. National Team Agreement
- iv. Program Manual

V. RESIGNATION AND RETIREMENT

Pair/groups may choose to retire from competition or resign from the national team. Resignation is required if there is a change in partnership (1 or more partners) and/or a change in competition level.

- A. Coaches must promptly notify the High-Performance Manager and Director of Acrobatics Program of changes in partnership status or level which may affect the pair/group's standing on SNT and/or ability to compete. This may include, but is not limited to, the retirement of athletes, changes in partnerships, changes in competition level, injuries, etc.
- B. Coaches should make all attempts to notify the High-Performance Manager and Director of Acrobatics Program before the information is made public. This includes social media.
- C. Due to the interdependent nature of partnerships, removal, retirement or resignation of any single athlete will be effective for the entire pair/group.

VI. ACROBATICS SELECTION COMMITTEE
