SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the 2025 Junior World Championship Team for Men's Artistic Gymnastics.

The maximum team size can be up to four (4) athletes, which includes one (1) traveling replacement athlete.

SECTION 2: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:

- Have a valid United States passport at the time of the 2025 U.S. Gymnastics Championships that does not expire for six (6) months after the conclusion of the World Championships.

2. Minimum FIG Requirements [if applicable]:

- Abide by the rules in the FIG including nationality/citizenship requirements.
- Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the [LOC].
- Comply with all FIG eligibility requirements found here: <https://www.gymnastics.sport/site/rules/#1>

3. NGB Requirements:

- Comply with the USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement.
- Comply with the USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct.
- Comply with the USA Gymnastics Safety and Response Policy.
- Athlete must be a minimum of 16 years old and a maximum of 18 years old on December 31, 2025.
- Athlete must have an active USA Gymnastics membership. Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Event.
- Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Event.

4. Anti-Doping Requirements:

- Agree to be bound by and adhere to all WADA, FIG USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of the WADA, FIG, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable. Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, FIG and/or the Local Organizing Committee.

Event names, dates and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process:

September 17-21, 2025	Level 10 National Team & World Championships Team Camp (petitions only) – USOPTC Colorado Springs, CO

SECTION 4: SELECTION PROCESS

Provide a step-by-step description of the selection process including an overview of the FIG Qualification System.

4.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

2025 Junior World Championships will consist of up to four (4) athletes, which includes one (1) traveling replacement athlete. Team and individual medals will be awarded. Up to two (2) non-traveling replacement athletes will be named.

4.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

The 2025 U.S. Gymnastics Championships will be the selection event for the Junior World Championships and is held on August 7-10, 2025. Athletes who are FIG age eligible (16-18 years) and U.S. citizens are qualified to the 2025 U.S. Gymnastics Championships through the Junior and Senior pathways laid out in the qualification procedures:

4.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

One (1) automatic spot on the 2025 Junior World Championship Team will be awarded to a (USAG) Senior athlete in the FIG 18 year age category. The FIG 18 year-old athlete will achieve an automatic spot if they meet both of the following criteria on the same day of competition:

- Achieve the highest single-day all-around final score of all FIG 18 year-old athletes from either day of competition at the 2025 US Championships (includes exponential D bonus), and
- Achieve an all-around D score of 27.0 or higher on the same day of competition at the 2025 US Championships

If no athletes achieve both of the criteria listed above on the same day, then there will be no automatic spot on the team, and that spot will be named using the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 5.2.

The two (2) remaining spots on the team will be named using the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 5.2.

The one (1) traveling replacement athlete and up to two (2) non-traveling replacement athletes will be named using the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 5.2.

SECTION 5: DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO NOMINATE ATHLETES

5.1 RATIONALE FOR UTILIZING DISCRETIONARY SELECTION:

The sport of gymnastics is a subjectively judged sport. The objective for the Men's Team is to achieve the highest possible results and win team and individual medals. Assessments must be performed to identify an athlete's ability to contribute to the objectives. Multiple factors will play a role when determining the best combination of athletes to achieve the stated objectives.

5.2 DEFINE THE DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO BE USED:

To be considered for a spot on the 2025 Junior World Championship Team, the following Discretionary Criteria will be evaluated by the Junior Selection Committee (JSC):

- Highest potential team score - Team scoring scenarios in a 3-3-2 competition format will be created, using results from the 2025 US Championships (with and without exponential D bonus). If an athlete has secured an automatic spot on the team, only team scoring scenarios with that athlete included will be considered.
- Ability to win a medal in an individual final - using results from an athlete's 2025 elite domestic championship competitions (Winter Cup, Development National Championships or US Championships) or USAG assigned international competitions in 2025, the athlete has demonstrated final scores (without exponential D bonus) that would rank in the top three (3) in the all-around or individual event finals from previous FIG international events in 2025, including but not limited to the following: DTB Team Challenge, European Championships and Asian Championships (Junior divisions).
- Ability to make an individual final – using results from an athlete's 2025 elite domestic championship competitions (Winter Cup, Development National Championships or US Championships) or USAG assigned international competitions in 2025, the athlete has demonstrated final scores (without exponential D bonus) that would rank in the top eight (8) finalists in the all-around or on an individual event in qualifications from previous FIG international events in 2025, including but not limited to the following: DTB Team Challenge, European Championships and Asian Championships (Junior divisions).
- Difficulty Scores – using results from an athlete's 2025 elite domestic championship competitions (Winter Cup, Development National Championships or US Championships) or USAG assigned international competitions in 2025, athlete has demonstrated a Difficulty Score (D scores) on an individual event that would rank in the top eight (8) finalists on an individual event in qualifications from

previous FIG international events in 2025, including but not limited to the following: DTB Team Challenge, European Championships and Asian Championships (Junior divisions).

- Current or previous National Team status & international achievement – athlete is currently or has been a member of the U.S. National Team and has demonstrated achievement by qualifying to all-around or individual event finals or earning medals for Team USA at USAG assigned international competition(s).

5.3 DEFINE THE PETITION PROCESS:

If an athlete is injured, ill, or there is an extenuating circumstance that prevents the athlete from completing the selection process, they may submit a petition to the JSC to be named directly to the Junior Worlds Team. Petitions will only be considered if the athlete has competed at least once in 2025 at either a domestic elite championship competition (Winter Cup, Development National Championships, or US Championships) or a USAG assigned international competition. The JSC will utilize the Discretionary Criteria above. If an athlete has not competed at any of the required competitions stated above in 2025, then their petition will not be considered by the JSC.

If a petition is approved, the athlete will be named to the 2025 Junior Worlds Team but will be required to show routines at the Level 10 National Team & World Championships Team Camp (September 17-21) for final confirmation. The athlete must be medically cleared to participate at the camp, which shall be determined by an examining physician verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff. Routines will be judged and must demonstrate the following:

- Ability to perform full routines on a competition surface at a level that warranted being named to the Team via Discretionary Criteria

5.4 SELECTION COMMITTEE

The committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections or other decisions and recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process.

SECTION 6: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

- All 2025 Junior World Championship Team members, including the traveling replacement athlete, must participate in a mandatory training camp at the USOPTC in Colorado Springs, CO. The dates of the camp are September 17-21, 2025. In the event there is an approved petition, that athlete(s) will be required to perform routines that meet the criteria laid out in Section 5.3.
- All 2025 Junior World Championship Team members, including the traveling replacement athlete, must participate in a mandatory training camp at the USOPTC in Colorado Springs, CO. The dates of the camp are October 15-19, 2025.
- All 2025 Junior World Championship Team members, including the traveling replacement athlete, must participate in all trainings and competition days once the team has departed for the Philippines.

SECTION 7: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

USA Gymnastics will nominate the Team, including any replacements/alternates after the conclusion of the final day of competition at the 2025 U.S. Gymnastics Championships, on or before August 10, 2025.

SECTION 8: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

8.1 USA GYMNASTICS JURISDICTION

- a. An athlete who is nominated to the Team may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:
 - i. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to USA Gymnastics Chief Programs Officer and Vice President of Men's Program requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. Injury or illness. Injury or illness which inhibits peak performance which shall be determined by an examining physician verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
 - iii. Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - iv. Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct: <https://usagym.org/about/governance/>
 - v. Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement.
 - vi. Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 of these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated WADA, FIG, USADA and/or, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code and the USA Gymnastics Safety and Response Policy, as applicable.
- c. Reclassification by the FIG such that the athlete's qualifying performance would not have qualified them for the Team.

SECTION 9: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 9.1 Should a vacancy on the team occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, that vacancy will be filled by the traveling replacement athlete. The Junior Selection Committee will name a new traveling replacement from the list of eligible non-traveling replacement athletes using the Discretionary Criteria in Section 5.2.
- 9.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 2.

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, if allowed, that vacancy will be filled by the traveling replacement athlete. The Junior Selection Committee will name a new traveling replacement from the list of eligible non-traveling replacement athletes using the Discretionary Criteria in Section 5.2, if allowed and travel permits.
- 10.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 2.

SECTION 11: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per the USA Gymnastics' Opportunity to Participate procedures <https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/Governance/grievance.pdf> and the USOPC Bylaws (applies only for a Protected Competition), Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 12: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Event:

SECTION 13: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on FIG rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in FIG rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Gymnastics.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not

have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 14: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 5.4) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 19) must comply with the USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest Policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business relationship interferes with, or may be perceived to interfere with a committee member's ability to be impartial and participate in the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. Any member of the Selection Committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to the USA Gymnastics' Ethics & Grievance Committee prior to the start of the selection process and may be required to recuse themselves from the Selection Committee discussions and/or voting.

If a conflict exists, the USA Gymnastics' Ethics & Grievance Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse themselves from participating in discussions and/or voting).

During its review, the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee may ask a Selection Committee member or an affected person for more information at its discretion. For example, if a Selection Committee member is required to recuse themselves from voting, the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee may still determine that a Selection Committee member who has relevant and necessary information related to athlete performance, such as a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the Selection Committee, provide that information to the Selection Committee if the information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and if the Selection Committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision.

Additionally, any person with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee (eandg@usagym.org). Reports may also be made anonymously through the [USOPC's Integrity Portal](#). No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest. In addition, the USOPC maintains a strict no retaliation policy that prohibits any employee, contractor, agent, volunteer, or member of the USOPC to take or threaten to take any action against an athlete for reporting information to or seeking assistance from the Office of the Athlete Ombuds.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the Men's Junior Selection Committee appointment process.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Olympic Winter Games, the Paralympic Games, the Paralympic Winter Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the Selection Committee to the NGB.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the NGB to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
