SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for nomination to the 2026 Artistic World Championships for USA Gymnastics.

The maximum Team size can be six male athletes, which includes five (5) team members and one (1) traveling replacement athlete.

SECTION 2: SELECTION PROCESS DIAGRAM

The following provides a high-level overview of how athletes will be nominated to the Team:



Note: This diagram is for informational purposes only. In the event of a conflict between the diagram and any written section herein, the written sections will take precedent.

SECTION 3: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:

- Have a valid United States passport at the time of nomination that does not expire for six months after the conclusion of the 2026 World Championships.
- 2. Local Organizing Committee (LOC) Requirements:
 - Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the LOC.
- 3. FIG (IF) Requirements:
 - Comply with all IF eligibility requirements which will be posted here once available:

- 4. USA Gymnastics Requirements:
 - Comply with the USA Gymnastics National Team Athlete Agreement.

 - Athlete must have an active USA Gymnastics membership.
 - Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in a sanctioned event.
 - Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in a sanctioned event.
 - Athletes age 18 and over must complete a background screen and US Center for SafeSport education training as required by the USA Gymnastics Safety and Response Policy.
- 5. Other minimum requirements to be eligible for the team
 - Agree to be bound by and adhere to all IOC, WADA, IF, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of the IOC, WADA, IF, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable.
 - Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, and/or IF.

SECTION 5: SELECTION PROCESS

Provide a step-by-step description of the selection process including an overview of the IF Qualification System.

5.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

2026 World Championships will consist of a team of five (5) athletes and one (1) traveling replacement athlete for a total of six (6) named spots. Up to three (3) non-traveling replacement athletes will be named.

5.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

5.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

The Men's Senior Selection Committee (SSC) will name the 2026 World Championships Team through the following method:

- a. Using final results, which include [exponential D-score Bonus](#), from the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships (2 days combined), the top all-around athlete will automatically qualify to the World Championship Team if they also place within the top three (3) on at least three (3) of the individual apparatus. The remaining team members and replacement athletes will be determined by the process described in 5.3.b and 5.3.c. Should the top all-around athlete not place in the top three (3) on at least three (3) different apparatus, they will not automatically be named to the Team, but that athlete may be selected through 5.3.b and 5.3.c.
- b. The remaining World Championships Team members will be selected by the SSC using three (3) sets of team-scoring scenarios. Team-scoring scenarios will be created using the results at the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships utilizing both a 5-4-3 (Qualifications) and 5-3-3 (Team Final) team competition format. The SSC will review the top five (5) team-scoring scenarios in each of the sets listed below. Should an athlete earn the automatic spot on the Worlds Team as described in 5.3.a, then only the top five team-scoring scenarios, which include that athlete, will be evaluated from each set:
 - Set 1 will include team scoring scenarios with the Men's Exponential D-score Bonus applied.
 - Set 2 will include team scoring scenarios without the Men's Exponential D-score Bonus applied (FIG scores)
 - Set 3 will include team scoring scenarios using individual event Difficulty (D-scores) only.

Once the top five (5) team-scoring scenarios are established for each data set, if the top team scoring scenario from each of the data sets listed above are made up of the exact same athletes, then that team will be named as the 2026 World Championship Team, unless the following occurs:

- The top teams, which are made up of the exact same athletes, are only able to compete three athletes (i.e. the other two athletes do not compete in a particular apparatus) in the Team Preliminary (Qualifications) competition on any apparatus. In this case, that team will not be named as the 2026 World

Championship Team, and the SSC will move to 5.3.c. to name the remainder of the Worlds Team and all replacement athletes.

If the top scoring teams from each of the three data sets are not the same, then the SSC will move to 5.3.c to name the remainder of the Worlds Team. The SSC will also use the process in 5.3.c in naming all traveling and non-traveling replacement athletes.

The pool of athletes eligible for selection through 5.3.c are as follows:

- Any athlete listed in the top five (5) team scoring scenarios from each of the three data sets listed in 5.3.b (after any team scenarios have been removed).
 - Any athlete who finished in the top three (3) in the all-around or on any individual event at the 2026 US Gymnastics Championships (2-days combined)
 - Any athlete who finished in the top three (3) in the [Men's Points Program](#) Final Results at the 2026 US Gymnastics Championships (2-days combined)
- c. The SSC will evaluate the pool of eligible athletes for the 2026 World Championships Team and all traveling and non-traveling replacement athletes using the Discretionary Criteria listed below, in no priority order.
- Final Event scores and rankings from the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships (with and without Bonus applied)
 - Team Scoring Scenarios (with and without Bonus applied)
 - Points Program Final results from the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships
 - Individual Event D-scores from the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships
 - Results from athlete's two most recent domestic elite championship competitions (Winter Cup/U.S. Championships) in 2025 or 2026 (with and without Bonus applied)
 - Results from major FIG sanctioned international competitions from 2025 & 2026. These events include, but are not limited to:
 - World Championships
 - FIG World Cups
 - Continental Championships
 - DTB Pokal
 - Major Games (Olympic Games, Asian Games, Pan American Games, Commonwealth Games, etc.)

SECTION 6: DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO NOMINATE ATHLETES

6.1 RATIONALE FOR UTILIZING DISCRETIONARY SELECTION:

The sport of gymnastics is a subjectively judged sport. The objective for the Men's Team is to achieve the highest possible results and win multiple medals. Assessments must be performed to identify an athlete's

ability to contribute to the objectives. Multiple factors will play a role when determining the best combination of athletes to achieve the stated objectives.

6.2 DEFINE THE DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO BE USED:

Refer to Section 5.3.c. for Discretionary Criteria.

6.3 DEFINE THE PETITION PROCESS

- a. A petition directly on to the 2026 World Championships Team may only be submitted by a member of the 2024 Olympic Team (including traveling replacement athletes) or 2025 World Championship Team (including non-traveling replacement athlete), or a member of the Senior National Team or Senior Development Team in the year 2026. In addition, the athlete must have competed in any capacity in at least one day of competition at the 2026 US Gymnastics Championships.
- b. Petitions directly on to the 2026 World Championships Team must follow the process below:
 - Petitions are due to the Senior Selection Committee Chairman via email prior to the conclusion of the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships.
 - All petitions must include the following:
 - Petition form to be completed:

 - Medical report/letter by an examining physician subject to verification by USAG medical staff
 - Athlete's return to play plan/timeline, or
 - Proof of medical clearance to participate subject to verification by USAG medical staff
 - For petitions directly on to the 2026 World Championships Team, the SSC will consider the Discretionary Criteria listed in Section 5.3.c.
 - The athlete will be required to show readiness at the 2026 Worlds Team Camp, taking place September 16-20 at the USOPTC in Colorado Springs, CO.
 - A show of readiness will require the athlete to perform their required routines with full difficulty across one or two competition days. They must perform their routines on a competition surface at a level that is competitive with the other team members, shows consistency, and supports their selection to the Team (may include judge evaluation).

6.4 SELECTION COMMITTEE

The committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections or other decisions and recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process.

SECTION 7: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

Specify the location, schedule, and duration of all mandatory training and/or competition for athletes who are nominated to the Team.

- All five (5) 2026 World Championship Team members and one (1) traveling replacement athlete must participate in a mandatory training camp at the USOPTC in Colorado Springs, CO. The dates of the camp are September 16-20, 2026. In the event there is an approved petition, that athlete(s) will be required to perform routines that meet the criteria laid out in Section 6.3.
- All five (5) 2026 World Championship Team members and one (1) traveling replacement athlete must participate in the Worlds pre-camp in 's-Hertogenbosch, Netherlands (TBC). The dates are October 8-12, 2026 (TBC). The team will travel to Rotterdam from 's-Hertogenbosch.

While waivers for mandatory training will not be unreasonably withheld, all athletes nominated to the Team should arrange for appropriate time off from school, work or other obligations in advance. Waivers will primarily be granted for injury or other similar incapacity or for a personal/family emergency. Requests for a waiver must be submitted in writing to the Men's Program Vice President as far in advance as possible.

SECTION 8: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

The nomination of athletes, including replacements, will be announced to all athletes after the conclusion of the final day of competition at the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships, on or before August 9, 2026.

SECTION 9: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

9.1 NGB JURISDICTION

- a. An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USA Gymnastics may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:
 - i. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to the USA Gymnastics Chief Programs Officer and the Men's Program Vice President/Director requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. Injury or illness. Injury or illness that inhibits peak performance, which shall be determined by an examining physician, with medical documentation, verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
 - iii. Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - iv. Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the [USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct](#).
 - v. Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed [USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement](#).
 - vi. Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 3 of these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated IOC, WADA, IF, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, the U.S. Center for

SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and USA Gymnastics Safety and Response policies, as applicable.

- c. Removal may only occur by action of the President of USA Gymnastics and the Men's Program Athlete Selection Representative (or another Athlete Representative appointed by the USA Gymnastics Athletes' Council in the case of a conflict of interest) after consultation with the Selection Committee, and an interview with the athlete and his coach. An athlete who is removed from the 2026 World Championships Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per [USA Gymnastics Grievance policy](#) and the [USOPC Bylaws](#) (Section 9).

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

10.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the LOC, the Senior Selection Committee will approve a replacement from the list of eligible replacement athletes.

10.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 3.

SECTION 11: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

11.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the LOC, if allowed, the Senior Selection Committee will approve a replacement from the list of eligible replacement athletes.

11.2 Any replacement of athletes must comply with these selection procedures in addition to World Gymnastics regulations including applicable Late Athlete Replacement (LAR) policies.

11.3 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 3.

SECTION 12: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per the USA Gymnastics' complaint procedures <https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/Governance/grievance.pdf> and the USOPC Bylaws, Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 13: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Team:

SECTION 14: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on IF rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in

the selection procedures caused by a change in IF rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Gymnastics.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 15: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 6.4) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 20) must comply with the USA Gymnastics' Conflict of Interest Policy https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/Governance/coi_policy.pdf to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USA Gymnastics' Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

SECTION 18: NON-RETALIATION

The USOPC and USA Gymnastics have zero tolerance for retaliation against people who make good faith reports of potential ethical, policy, or legal violations, or who cooperate with investigations of those reports. That means no USOPC or USA Gymnastics staff, Board or Committee member, or volunteer may threaten, harass, discriminate against, or take any negative employment or related action (e.g., discharge, demotion, suspension, negative review) on that basis.

SECTION 19: SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

USA Gymnastics will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents from the selection process.

A Selection Committee report signed by the Independent Observer, outlining the work and decisions of the Committee, will be made available for distribution to all athletes and coaches who participated in the Selection Events at least 14 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, unless the Selection Committee meeting occurs less than 30 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, in which case the minutes will be published within a reasonable timeframe after the Selection Committee meeting under the circumstances. The report will be made public on the USA Gymnastics website. USA Gymnastics retains the sole discretion to determine the contents and timing of the report.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Paralympic Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted to the USOPC by an NGB for participation in a Delegation Event.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

1. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
2. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

For Protected Competitions, USOPC's DRU oversees the administration of dispute resolution services to athletes and other members of NGBs for grievances under the USOPC's jurisdiction to ensure the complaints are heard in a timely and fair manner. USOPC ETHICS AND COMPLIANCE

USOPC's Ethics and Compliance team is responsible for ensuring the USOPC and NGBs comply with the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act, their own bylaws and policies, and any other applicable laws or regulations.
