Rhythmic Individual Athlete Selection Procedures

2025 Junior Pan American Games

- Publication Date: 05/07/2025

SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the 2025 Junior Pan American Games (Games) in Rhythmic Gymnastics: Individual.

The maximum team size can be 2 female individual gymnasts.

SECTION 2: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:

- Have a valid United States passport at the time of the Elite Qualifier that does not expire for six (6) months after the conclusion of the Games.

2. Minimum Panam Sports Requirements:

- Abide by the rules in the Panam Sports Constitution, including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Panam Sports Constitution (Article 34.4-7).
- Abide by the Panam Sports Eligibility of Conditions Form/Conditions of Participation Form

3. LOC Requirements:

- Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the LOC.

4. Continental Federation PAGU Requirements:

- Comply with all PAGU eligibility requirements found here: [\[link\]](#).

5. USOPC Requirements:

- Comply with all USOPC rules applicable to the Games (e.g., Demonstrations).
- Complete all USOPC Games Registration requirements by the stated deadline.
- Comply with the USOPC Delegation Terms, including the Conduct Requirements, which will be made available here: <https://www.usopc.org/games-and-qualification>
- Comply with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#) and the [U.S. Center for SafeSport Code](#).
- Undergo a background screen in accordance with the current [USOPC Background Check Policy](#) if you will be age 18 or older.

6. USA Gymnastics Requirements:

- Comply with the USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement.
- Comply with the USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct.
- Comply with the USA Gymnastics Safety and Response Policy.
- Athlete must have an active USA Gymnastics membership. Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.

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- Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.

SECTION 3: OTHER MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE TEAM

- Meet the U.S. Center for SafeSport's education and training requirements in accordance with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#) if you will be 18 or older on the day after the Closing Ceremony.
- Agree to be bound by and adhere to all Panam Sports, WADA, CF, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of Panam Sports, WADA, CF, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable. Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, CF and/or the Local Organizing Committee.

SECTION 4: EVALUATIVE EVENTS

Event names, dates and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process:

SECTION 5: SELECTION PROCESS

Provide a step-by-step description of the selection process including an overview of the *PAGU* Qualification System.

The qualification system is outlined below, with the qualifying event for the NOC being the 2024 Junior Pan American Championships in Guatemala City, GUA:

Individual

- 1-14 places: A maximum of 2 gymnasts from 7 different NOCs, whose teams are in the top 7 positions of the Qualification Competition.
- 15-19 places: NOCs with the best Individual All Around position of the Qualification Competition and that have not earned quotas according to the above criteria.
- 20 place: 1 gymnast from the Host NOC, as long as the NOC has not qualified according to the above criteria.

In the Individual qualifying event, USA earned a place for 2 gymnasts per criteria 1

5.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

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5.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

The Elite Qualifier is the qualifying event for the 2025 Junior Pan American Games.

Qualification to the Elite Qualifier is through the Hope/JR Classic events (Eastern, Central and Western) and/or National Team exemption from the Classic, outline in the Rhythmic Rules and Policies, Chapter 3, pp. 22-26:

- A. The USA Rhythmic Classic is an annual competition for all USA Hope, JR and SR gymnasts which serves as the qualifying event to the Elite Qualifier.
- B. Multiple Classic events will be hosted simultaneously, divided geographically and/or by region for comparable distribution of athletes throughout the country (e.g., Eastern Rhythmic Classic, Central Rhythmic Classic, Western Rhythmic Classic).
- C. Qualification to USA Rhythmic Classic

5.2.1. To enter a JR/SR Rhythmic Classic, an individual gymnast must meet all age and level eligibility requirements USA Hope/JR/SR and have competed All-around at least two sanctioned events prior to the Classic.

- Qualification to the Elite Qualifier
 - All current Individual National Team members are qualified automatically.
 - USA Hope, JR and SRs qualify to the Elite Qualifier from their designated Rhythmic Classic competition

5.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

Automatic bid: the top ranked All-Around Junior at the Elite Qualifier will be named to the Team. The second Junior, as well as a non-travelling replacement athlete, will be nominated from the Discretionary criteria below:

SECTION 6: DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO NOMINATE ATHLETES

6.1 RATIONALE FOR UTILIZING DISCRETIONARY SELECTION:

Rhythmic Gymnastics is a subjectively judged event, and an athlete can be severely penalized for a single error in individual competition, which may not accurately reflect her complete readiness or proven ability to demonstrate readiness in world-level competition.

The 2025 Junior Pan American Games have implications for the 2027 Pan American Games per the Asuncion 2025 Qualification System:

In Rhythmic Gymnastics, the gold medalist of the individual All Around event will qualify directly to the Lima 2027 Pan American Games. A total of 1 quota will be allocated in this competition. The quota earned for the Lima 2027 Pan American Games will be for the athlete, not for the country. This quota will be additional to the ones earned for Lima 2027. If the gymnast that earned the place is unable to participate in the Lima 2027 Pan American Games, said place will be lost and may not be transferred to the country or to any other athlete in another position in the Asuncion 2025 Junior Pan American Games

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6.2 DEFINE THE DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO BE USED:

Readiness to compete—current health status and physical preparedness of each gymnast

- The overall objectives of the competitive season and the ability of each athlete/Group to meet that objective for the JR Pan American Games: demonstrated potential from 2025 international results and national results to earn the top Individual position in the continental Games;
- Results from the 2025 international assignments officially assigned by USA Gymnastics and the 2025 Elite Qualifier; the analysis of international results will include an evaluation of the strength of the competitive fields (the technical level presented by the top-ranked athletes and by the direct competitors of USA).
- World Class presentation: the strength, endurance, technical execution standard and artistic components commensurate with World presentation
- Previous proven officially-assigned international and USA Gymnastics national results from 2024, if available and/or determinative

6.3 DEFINE THE PETITION PROCESS:

If an athlete is injured, ill, or there is an extenuating circumstance that prevents the athlete from completing the selection process, they may submit a petition to the selection committee prior to the end of the Elite Qualifier to be named directly to the JR Pan American Games Team. Petitions will only be considered for a current Junior National Team member who has officially represented the country this competitive season internationally. The selection committee will utilize the Discretionary Criteria above.

6.4 SELECTION COMMITTEE

The committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections or other decisions and recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process.

- International Elite Coach Representative
- Judge Representative
- Athlete Representative

SECTION 7: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

The gymnasts will train in their home facilities prior to the Games.

SECTION 8: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

USA Gymnastics will nominate the Team, including the replacement athlete, to the USOPC on or before May 21, 2025.

SECTION 9: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

9.1 NGB JURISDICTION

- a. USA Gymnastics has jurisdiction over athlete nominees until athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee. An athlete who is nominated to the Team may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:

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- i. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to the USA Gymnastics Chief Programs Officer and Vice President of the Rhythmic Program requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. Injury or illness. Injury or illness which inhibits peak performance which shall be determined by an examining physician verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
 - iii. Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - iv. Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct: <https://usagym.org/about/governance/>
 - v. Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement.
 - vi. Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 and Section 3 of these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated WADA, FIG, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and the NGB SafeSport Policy, as applicable.

9.2 USOPC JURISDICTION

- a. Once Athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team.
- b. USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply in addition to the NGB Code of Conduct. The Delegation Conduct Requirements in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and are made available during the Games registration process.
- c. The USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the USOPC Dispute Resolution Policy and Hearing Procedures.

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, the named replacement athlete will fill the vacancy.
- 10.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 2-3.

SECTION 11: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF

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ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

Note that after submission of entries by name, Late Athlete Replacement procedures will apply, if applicable.

11.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, if allowed: same as above.

11.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 2-3.

SECTION 12: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per USA Gymnastics' grievance procedures <https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/Governance/grievance.pdf> and the USOPC Bylaws (applies only for a Protected Competition), Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 13: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Games:

- USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement

SECTION 14: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on Panam Sports rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in Panam Sports rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Gymnastics.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 15: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 6.3) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 20) must comply with the USA Gymnastics' Conflict of Interest Policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USA Gymnastics' Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee. https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About USA Gymnastics/Governance/coi_policy.pdf

A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business relationship or interferes with, or maybe perceived to interfere with a committee member's ability to be impartial and participate in the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. Any member of the Selection Committee who has an actual, possible,

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or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to USA Gymnastics' Ethics and Grievance Committee prior to the start of the selection process and may be required to recuse themselves from the Selection Committee discussions and/or voting.

If a conflict exists, USA Gymnastics' Ethics and Grievance Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse themselves from participating in discussions and/or voting).

During its review, USA Gymnastics' Ethics and Grievance Committee may ask a Selection Committee member or an affected person for more information at its discretion. For example, if a Selection Committee member is required to recuse themselves from voting, USA Gymnastics' Ethics and Grievance Committee may still determine that a Selection Committee member who has relevant and necessary information related to athlete performance, such as a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the Selection Committee, provide that information to the Selection Committee if the information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and if the Selection Committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision.

Additionally, any person with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to USA Gymnastics' Ethics and Grievance Committee at eandg@usagym.org. Reports may also be made anonymously through the [USOPC's Integrity Portal](#). No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest. In addition, the USOPC maintains a strict no retaliation policy that prohibits any employee, contractor, agent, volunteer, or member of the USOPC to take or threaten to take any action against an athlete for reporting information to or seeking assistance from the Office of the Athlete Ombuds.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the NGB Selection Committee appointment process.

SECTION 18: NON-RETALIATION

The USOPC and USA Gymnastics have zero tolerance for retaliation against people who make good faith reports of potential ethical, policy, or legal violations, or who cooperate with investigations of those reports. That means no USOPC or USA Gymnastics staff, Board or Committee member, or volunteer may threaten, harass, discriminate against, or take any negative employment or related action (e.g., discharge, demotion, suspension, negative review) on that basis.

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SECTION 19: SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

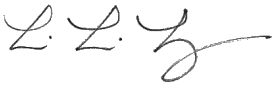

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APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Olympic Winter Games, the Paralympic Games, the Paralympic Winter Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted to the USOPC by an NGB for participation in the Games.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the USOPC to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
