SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the Senior World Championships in Rhythmic Gymnastics-Individual.

The minimum team size is 2 female and the maximum team size is 3 females.

SECTION 2: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:
 - Have a valid United States passport at the time of USA Gymnastics Championships that does not expire for six (6) months after the conclusion of the Event.
2. Minimum FIG Requirements:
 - Abide by the rules in the FIG including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the LOC
 - Comply with all FIG eligibility requirements found here:
https://www.gymnastics.sport/publicdir/rules/files/en_1.1%20-%20Technical%20Regulations%202025.pdf
3. USA Gymnastics Requirements:
 - Comply with the USA Gymnastics [National Team Agreement](#).
 - Comply with the USA Gymnastics [Code of Conduct](#).
 - Comply with the USA Gymnastics [Safety and Response Policy](#).
 - Athlete must have an active USA Gymnastics membership. Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Event.
 - Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Event.
 - Comply with the Rhythmic National Team Handbook
4. Anti-Doping Requirements:
 - Agree to be bound by and adhere to all WADA, FIG, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of the WADA, FIG, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable. Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, FIG, and/or the Local Organizing Committee.

SECTION 4: SELECTION PROCESS

Provide a step-by-step description of the selection process including an overview of the FIG Qualification System.

4.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

Each NF has the right to participate with 2 or 3 Individual gymnast(s).

Each NF has the right to choose the number of routines to be performed by its gymnast(s).

Each NF has the right to choose the apparatus to be performed by its gymnast(s).

Each gymnast must perform at least one (1) routine. The minimum number of routines per gymnast is 1 and the maximum is 4 routines. The maximum number of routines per NF is 8 in total, i.e. two (2) routine per apparatus.

4.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

2025 USA Gymnastics Championships is the qualifying event for the 2025 SR World Championships

Qualification to USA Gymnastics Championships is outlined in the Rhythmic Rules and Policies, Chapter 3:

A. Qualification to the USA Gymnastics Championships

- 1. Qualifying numbers will be set by USA Gymnastics.*
- 2. Qualification from the Elite Qualifier, with the following pre-qualified exemptions:*
 - i. The top 6 all-around Senior individuals from the Rhythmic Challenge will automatically qualify to the USA Gymnastics Elite Championships.*
 - ii. Any current Senior National Team gymnasts unable to compete at the Elite Qualifier due to injury or illness verified by a doctor, extenuating circumstance verified by the Vice President of the Rhythmic Program, or with conflicting international assignments, may advance to the USA Gymnastics Elite Championships.*
 - 1) Any gymnast who meets the above criteria and chooses not to compete at the Elite Qualifier must notify USA Gymnastics within four weeks of the Elite Qualifier.*

Gymnasts competing in the USA Gymnastics Elite Championships must be citizens of the United States. Gymnasts who have an FIG license for another country or have represented another country in international competition, regardless of citizenship (Foreign Athletes), who are ineligible to represent the United States at the Olympic Games, may not participate in the USA Gymnastics Elite Championships.

Gymnasts who hold a current FIG license for another country may not participate in any session of the USA Gymnastics Championships.

Petitions due to injury, illness, or extenuating circumstances to the USA Gymnastics Championships are only accepted for current National Team members. Petitions must be submitted to the Vice President of the Rhythmic Program for approval by the Rhythmic Program Committee.

4.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM: automatic bid plus Discretionary Criteria

1. **The Senior All-Around Champion will automatically be named to the World Team; the Committee will decide the event(s) allocation for this gymnast.**
2. **The remaining gymnasts/events will be named using discretionary criteria.**

SECTION 5: DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO NOMINATE ATHLETES

5.1 RATIONALE FOR UTILIZING DISCRETIONARY SELECTION:

Rhythmic Gymnastics is a subjectively judged event, and an athlete can be severely penalized for a single error in individual competition, which may not accurately reflect her complete readiness or proven ability to demonstrate readiness in world-level competition.

5.2 DEFINE THE DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO BE USED:

Selection criteria considered in the following order:

- Readiness to compete—current health status and physical preparedness of each gymnast
- The overall objectives of the competitive season and the ability of each athlete to meet the objective for the SR World Championships: **Finish in the top 8 AA and top 15 AA respectively**
- Results from 2025 international events officially assigned by USA Gymnastics and the 2025 USA Gymnastics Championships; analysis of international results will include an evaluation of the strength of the competitive fields (the technical level presented by the top-ranked athletes and by the direct competitors of USA) in relation to the overall objective.
- World Class presentation: the strength, endurance, technical execution standard and artistic components commensurate with World presentation
- Previous proven national results in 2025, if determinative
- Previous proven international results officially assigned by USA Gymnastics from 2024, if available and/or determinative

5.3 DEFINE THE PETITION PROCESS:

If an athlete is injured, ill, or there is an extenuating circumstance that prevents the athlete from completing the selection process, she may submit a petition to the selection committee by the end of USA Gymnastics Championships to be named directly to the SR World Championships Team. Petitions will only be considered for a current Senior National Team member who have officially represented the country internationally in 2025. The selection committee will utilize the Discretionary Criteria above.

5.4 SELECTION COMMITTEE

The committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections or other decisions and recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process:

An independent Observer of Procedure appointed by a sub-committee of the USA Gymnastics Board of Directors will be present at the final selection meeting. (No voice, no vote).

SECTION 6: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

SECTION 7: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

USA Gymnastics will nominate the Team on or before June 23, 2025

SECTION 8: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

8.1 NGB JURISDICTION

- a. USA Gymnastics has jurisdiction over athlete nominees until athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee. An athlete who is nominated to the Team may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:
 - i. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to the USA Gymnastics Chief Programs Officer and Vice President of the Rhythmic Program requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. Injury or illness. Injury or illness which inhibits peak performance which shall be determined by an examining physician verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
 - iii. Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - iv. Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct:

- v. Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement.
- vi. Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 and Section 3 of these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated WADA, FIG, USADA and/or, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code and the NGB SafeSport Policy, as applicable. Reclassification by the FIG such that the athlete's qualifying performance would not have qualified them for the Team.

SECTION 9: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

9.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, *The Athlete Selection Committee will name a replacement athlete at the time of the Team nomination to fill a potential vacancy using discretionary criteria.*

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

10.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, if allowed, *See 9.1*

SECTION 11: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per USA Gymnastics' grievance procedures <https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/Governance/grievance.pdf> and the USOPC Bylaws (applies only for a Protected Competition), Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 12: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Event:

SECTION 13: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on FIG rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in FIG rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes

immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to NGB.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 14: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 5.3) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 19) must comply with the USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest Policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

SECTION 17: NON-RETALIATION

SECTION 18: SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

NGB will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process as required by the NGB's Records Retention Policy.

An Athlete Selection Committee report signed by the Independent Observer, outlining the work and decisions of the ASC, will be made available for distribution to all athletes and coaches who participated in the Selection Events at least 14 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, unless the Selection Committee meeting occurs less than 30 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, in which case the minutes will be published within a reasonable timeframe after the Selection Committee meeting under the circumstances. The report will be made public on the USA Gymnastics website. USA Gymnastics retains the sole discretion to determine the contents and timing of the report.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Olympic Winter Games, the Paralympic Games, the Paralympic Winter Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the Selection Committee to the NGB.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the NGB to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
