SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the 2025 Junior Pan American Games (Games) in Trampoline Gymnastics.

The maximum team size can be four (4) athletes; two (2) male and two (2) female with one (1) non-traveling alternate in each gender.

SECTION 2: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:

- Have a valid United States passport at the time of nomination (May 12th, 2025) that does not expire for six (6) months after the conclusion of the Games.

2. Minimum Panam Sports Requirements:

- Abide by the rules in the Panam Sports Constitution, including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Panam Sports Constitution (Article 34.4-7).
- Abide by the Panam Sports Eligibility of Conditions Form/Conditions of Participation Form

3. LOC Requirements:

- Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the LOC.

4. Continental Federation (CF) Requirements:

- Comply with all PAGU eligibility requirements found here:

5. USOPC Requirements:

- Comply with all USOPC rules applicable to the Games (e.g., Demonstrations).
- Complete all USOPC Games Registration requirements by the stated deadline. June 22, 2025
- Comply with the USOPC Delegation Terms, including the Conduct Requirements, which will be made available here: <https://www.usopc.org/games-and-qualification>
- Comply with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#) and the [U.S. Center for SafeSport Code](#).
- Undergo a background screen in accordance with the current [USOPC Background Check Policy](#) if you will be age 18 or older.

6. NGB Requirements:

- Comply with the [USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement](#).
- Comply with the [USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct](#).

- Comply with the [USA Gymnastics SafeSport Policy](#).
- Athlete must have an active USA Gymnastics membership.
- Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.
- Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.
- Athlete accepting assignment to the 2025 World Games will not be eligible for selection to the 2025 Jr Pan American Games.

SECTION 3: OTHER MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE TEAM

- Meet the U.S. Center for SafeSport's education and training requirements in accordance with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#) if you will be 18 or older on the day after the Closing Ceremony.
- Agree to be bound by and adhere to all Panam Sports, WADA, PAGU, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of Panam Sports, WADA, PAGU, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable. Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, PAGU and/or the Local Organizing Committee.

5.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

Quota allocation was determined by successful results at the 2024 Pan American Championships. Through this process, Team USA was allocated two (2) competitive spots for males and two (2) competitive spots for

females, and is additionally selecting one (1) non-traveling alternate per gender.

5.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

Additional information regarding the final competition schedule and the competition format of the Evaluative Events in section 4 will be published on the [USA Gymnastics website](#) prior to the start of each of the Events.

Event names, dates, locations and description of how athletes qualify for any Evaluative Events, or procedures that are prerequisites to attend any of the Evaluative Events.

- To qualify to compete at the Evaluative Events, athletes must meet mobility requirements as a Senior Elite as stated in the 2024 [T&T Rules & Policies](#) (Sec. VI).
- To compete at the 2025 USA Gymnastics Championships athletes must meet qualification requirements as stated in the 2024 [T&T Rules & Policies](#) (Sec. VI).

5.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

1. Definitions

- Qualification Score
The Qualification Score is the counting routine from Routine 1 and Routine 2 from Qualifications at a single Evaluative Event.
- Final Score:
Trampoline: The Final Score is the score of the Finals routine at a single Evaluative Event.
- Combined Score:
The Combined Score is the sum of the highest two (2) Qualification Scores plus the highest (1) finals score from the three (3) Evaluative Events.

2. Process for selection

Criterion 1: Two (2) athletes with the highest **Combined Score** at the conclusion of the three (3) Evaluative Events will be selected for the 2025 Jr Pan American Games.

- Where there is a tie in Combined Score, the athlete with the higher Qualification Score will be ranked higher.
- Where there is a tie in both Combined Score and Qualification Score, discretionary selection criteria will apply.

Criterion 2: One (1) athlete with the **next highest Combined Score** at the conclusion of the three (3) Evaluative Events will be selected as the non-traveling alternate for the 2025 Jr Pan American Games team.

- Where there is a tie in Combined Score, the athlete with the higher Qualification Score will be ranked higher.
- Where there is a tie in both Combined Score and Qualification Score, discretionary selection criteria will apply.

- a. Men's and women's synchronized trampoline pairs will be comprised of athletes named to the 2025 Jr Pan American Games Trampoline team.

SECTION 6: DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO NOMINATE ATHLETES

6.1 **RATIONALE FOR UTILIZING DISCRETIONARY SELECTION:**

- While Trampoline & Tumbling is a subjectively judged discipline, these procedures primarily rely on objective criteria for selecting athletes to the 2025 Jr Pan American Games Team through rankings and results at the Evaluative Events. However, there is one (1) scenario where discretionary selection criteria will be evaluated:
 - Breaking a tie in both Combined Score and Qualification Score during any of the steps outlined above

6.2 **DEFINE THE DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO BE USED:**

- Discretionary Criteria used by Selection Committees (not listed in order of importance):
 - 2024-2025 international performances, including scores and caliber of the events.
 - 2024-2025 domestic performances at the 2024 & 2025 Winter Classic, 2024 & 2025 Elite Challenge and 2024 & 2025 USA Gymnastics Championships, including scores, and caliber of the events (strength of field).
 - Any physical, training or performance factor, which may inhibit peak performance at the 2025 Jr Pan American Games.
 - Demonstrated professional attitude, compliance with responsibility manual, and ability to positively contribute to the team dynamic.

6.3 **SELECTION COMMITTEE**

- The Program Committee Chair, the Program Director, and the National or Junior National Coordinator of the applicable discipline and others as needed (each, an “Invited Guest”) may be invited to attend the meetings as guests.
2. Conflict of Interest
 - a. All members of the Selection Committee and Invited Guests must comply with the USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest policy, which shall include completing and submitting a disclosure form for review by the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee prior to convening the committee.
 - b. Any member of the Selection Committee or Invited Guest who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee prior to the start of the selection process and/or recuse him/herself from the review process and/or voting. If a conflict exists, the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member’s level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse him/herself from participating in discussions and/or voting). For example, if it is determined that a committee member must recuse him/herself from voting, the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee may still determine that a committee member who has relevant and necessary information with respect to athlete performance may, if requested by the Selection Committee, provide such information to the committee so long as such information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and so long as the committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision. The committee member must not otherwise influence other members of the committee in the selection process.
 - c. Additionally, any person (including any potentially impacted athlete or coach of a potentially impacted athlete) with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the potential conflict of interest to the USA Gymnastics Ethics & Grievance Committee. Reports may be made anonymously. No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest.
 - d. Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with USA Gymnastics’ [Selection Committee charter](#).
 3. Each Selection Committee may request any information from any person or entity that they reasonably believe will be helpful in the decision-making process.

SECTION 7: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

SECTION 8: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

NGB will nominate the Team, including any replacements/alternates to the USOPC on or before June 22nd, 2025.

SECTION 9: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

9.1 NGB JURISDICTION

- a. NGB has jurisdiction over athlete nominees until athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee. An athlete who is nominated to the Team may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by NGB:
 - i. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to the USA Gymnastics' Chief of Programs and T&T Program Director requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. Injury or illness. Injury or illness which inhibits peak performance which shall be determined by an examining physician and verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
 - iii. Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - iv. Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct: [here](#)
 - v. Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement.
 - vi. Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 and Section 3 of these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated WADA, PAGU, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and the USA Gymnastics SafeSport Policy, as applicable.
- c. Removal may only occur by action of the President of USA Gymnastics and the Athlete Selection Representative (or another Athlete Representative appointed by the USA Gymnastics Athletes' Council in the case of a conflict of interest) after consultation with the Selection Committee, and an interview with the athlete and her coach. An athlete who is removed from the team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per USA Gymnastics [Grievance Policy](#).

9.2 USOPC JURISDICTION

- a. Once Athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team.
- b. USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply in addition to the NGB Code of Conduct. The Delegation Conduct Requirements in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and are made available during the Games registration process.
- c. The USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the USOPC Dispute Resolution Policy and Hearing Procedures.

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee,

Provided the quota was allocated by country (as opposed to the athlete by name), the replacement athlete will fill the vacancy and a new replacement will be named using the process outlined in Section 3. If the quota was allocated to an athlete by name, no replacement will be named.

10.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 2-3.

SECTION 11: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

11.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, if allowed.

Provided the quota was allocated by country (as opposed to the athlete by name), the replacement athlete will fill the vacancy, provided USA Gymnastics is still authorized to add a replacement athlete to the Team in accordance with the FIG Qualification System, and any applicable IOC and/or LOC rules.

11.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 2-3.

SECTION 12: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per the NGB's complaint procedures ([here](#)) and the USOPC Bylaws (applies only for a Protected Competition), Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 13: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

SECTION 14: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on Panam Sports and PAGU rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in Panam Sports and/or PAGU rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to NGB.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should

cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 15: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 6.3) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 20) must comply with the USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest Policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USA Gymnastics Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee. [COI Policy](#)

A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business relationship or interferes with, or maybe perceived to interfere with a committee member's ability to be impartial and participate in the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. Any member of the Selection Committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to the USA Gymnastics Ethics and Grievance Committee prior to the start of the selection process and may be required to recuse themselves from the Selection Committee discussions and/or voting.

If a conflict exists, the USA Gymnastics Ethics and Grievance Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse themselves from participating in discussions and/or voting).

During its review, the USA Gymnastics Ethics and Grievance Committee may ask a Selection Committee member or an affected person for more information at its discretion. For example, if a Selection Committee member is required to recuse themselves from voting, the USA Gymnastics Ethics and Grievance Committee may still determine that a Selection Committee member who has relevant and necessary information related to athlete performance, such as a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the Selection Committee, provide that information to the Selection Committee if the information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and if the Selection Committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision.

Additionally, any person with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to the USA Gymnastics Ethics and Grievance Committee at eandg@usagym.org. Reports may also be made anonymously through the [USOPC's Integrity Portal](#). No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest. In addition, the USOPC maintains a strict no retaliation policy that prohibits any employee, contractor, agent, volunteer, or member of the USOPC to take or threaten to take any action against an athlete for reporting information to or seeking assistance from the Office of the Athlete Ombuds.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the USA Gymnastics Selection Committee appointment process.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Olympic Winter Games, the Paralympic Games, the Paralympic Winter Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted to the USOPC by an NGB for participation in the Games.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the USOPC to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
