SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the 2026 World Championships in Women's Artistic Gymnastics. The maximum team size can be five (5) female athletes, one (1) traveling replacement athlete, and one (1) non-traveling replacement athlete. The athlete must be a minimum of 16 years old (born 2010) or older on or before December 31, 2026.

SECTION 2: SELECTION PROCESS DIAGRAM

The following provides a high-level overview of how athletes will be nominated to the Team:

SECTION 3: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:
 - Have a valid United States passport at the start of the 2026 American Classic that does not expire for six (6) months after the conclusion of the 2026 World Championships.
2. Local Organizing Committee (LOC) Requirements:
 - Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the LOC.
3. World Gymnastics (IF) Requirements:
 - Abide by the rules in World Gymnastics including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the Local Organizing Committee.
 - Comply with all [World Gymnastics eligibility requirements](#).
4. USA Gymnastics Requirements:
 - Comply with the USA Gymnastics National Team Athlete Agreement.

 - Athlete must have an active USA Gymnastics membership.
 - Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in a sanctioned event.
 - Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in a sanctioned event.
 - Athletes age 18 and over must complete a background screen and US Center for SafeSport education training as required by the USA Gymnastics Safety and Response Policy.
5. Other minimum requirements to be eligible for the team
 - Agree to be bound by and adhere to all IOC, WADA, IF, USADA, and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies, and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of the IOC, WADA, IF, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable.
 - Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, and/or IF.

SECTION 5: SELECTION PROCESS

Provide a step-by-step description of the selection process, including an overview of the IF Qualification System.

5.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

The 2026 World Championships Team will consist of up to five (5) female athletes, one (1) traveling replacement athlete, and one (1) non-traveling replacement athlete.

5.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

1. Qualification to the 2026 American Classic, the 2026 U.S. Classic, and 2026 U.S. Championships is:
 - By score as listed on the [Elite Qualification Chart](#).
 - By being one of the six (6) members (including the two (2) named on-traveling replacement athletes) of the 2025 World Championships Team.
 - Accepted petitioned athletes.
2. Invitations to the World Selection Event
 - In addition to the top two (2) All Around athletes from the combined rank order of two days of competition at the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships, the Athlete Selection Committee will invite a minimum of eight (8) additional athletes from among the competitors at the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships and petitioned athletes to the World Team Selection Event, utilizing the discretionary criteria outlined in Section 6.

5.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

1. Athletes will earn nomination to the Team as follows.
 - The World Team Selection Event and U.S. Championships will be used to select team members for the 2026 World Championships Team.
 - Team members and the traveling and non-traveling replacement athletes will be named at the conclusion of the 2026 World Team Selection Event.
 - The World Team Selection Event will have two days of competition; the first day is an All Around competition. On day two, athletes will compete on a minimum of one (1) event as determined by

the Athlete Selection Committee, but no more than three (3) events.

- For purposes of determining automatic qualification, the Athlete Selection Committee will calculate each athlete's composite score using the following methodology:
 - The athlete's two-day All-Around total from the U.S. Championships will account for 40% of the composite score.
 - The athlete's day one All-Around score from the World Selection Event will account for 60% of the composite score.
 - The combined weighted score will be used to rank eligible athletes. The two (2) highest-ranked athletes based on this composite score will be automatically named to the five-member World Championships Team, provided all eligibility and verification requirements are met.
- Using the discretionary selection criteria listed in Section 6, the Athlete Selection Committee will name the remaining three (3) members, one (1) traveling replacement athlete, and one (1) non-traveling replacement athlete to the 2026 World Championships Team after the World Team Selection Event.

SECTION 6: DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO NOMINATE ATHLETES

6.1 RATIONALE FOR UTILIZING DISCRETIONARY SELECTION:

The sport of gymnastics is a subjectively judged event. The current rules do not require athletes to compete in the all-around competition, which necessitates evaluating individual event strength and contribution to total team score in order to maximize medal potential.

6.2 DEFINE THE DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO BE USED:

The Athlete Selection Committee will use the following criteria, in no particular order, to select the athletes for the 2026 World Championships Team.

- Results from the 2026 American Classic
- Results from the 2026 U.S. Classic
- Results from the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships
- Results from the 2026 World Team Selection Event
- Results from 2025-2026 USA Gymnastics official International Assignments
- D-Scores (Difficulty) – achieved at any official international assignment or national event during the 2025-2026 competitive season and/or qualification event listed in Section 4.
- E-Scores (Execution) - achieved at any official international assignment or national event during the 2025-2026 competitive season and/or qualification event listed in Section 4.
- Consistency - percentage of made routines at any official international assignment or national event during the 2025-2026 competitive season and/or qualification events listed in Section 4.
- Composite Strength of all the Team members with consideration of potential All Around and Individual Event medals.

- World Class presentation - the strength, endurance, technical execution standard and artistic components commensurate with World and Olympic presentation.
- Readiness to compete - current health status and physical preparedness of each gymnast.
- Physical capability to fulfill the training plan as outlined in the Women's Program Manual.

6.3 DEFINE THE PETITION PROCESS

1. Procedures for petitioning into the 2026 American Classic, 2026 U.S. Classic, and the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships are listed in the 2025-2026 Elite Women's [Rules and Policies](#).
2. If an athlete is injured, ill, or there is an extenuating circumstance that prevents the athlete from completing the selection process, petitions into the World Team Selection Event will be considered by the Athlete Selection Committee and administered by the Vice President of Women's Program, for any member of a previous Olympic team or World Championships team, any athlete who has competed at the 2026 Winter Cup, 2026 American Classic, the 2026 U.S. Classic, the 2026 U.S. Gymnastics Championships, or any athlete who competed in an official National team assigned international competition in the fall of 2025 or spring of 2026. A junior athlete transitioning to the senior age division who has not competed in a senior national or international competition in the current year is not eligible to petition.
 - a. In order to be considered by the Athlete Selection Committee, petitions must be submitted in writing to the Vice President of Women's Program as soon as practical after the athlete becomes aware of her inability to participate in the process described above, but no later than **September 22, 2026**.
 - b. The petition must state the specific injury, illness or unusual circumstance which prohibited the athlete from participating in the competitive process. In the case of a petition based upon injury or illness, the petition must be accompanied by a physician's statement, which is subject to verification by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
3. Athletes may not petition directly to the 2026 World Championships Team.

6.4 SELECTION COMMITTEE

The committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections or other decisions and recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process.

- An independent Observer of Procedure appointed by a sub-committee of the USA Gymnastics Board of Directors will be present at the final selection meeting. (Process voice, no vote).

SECTION 7: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

While waivers for mandatory training will not be unreasonably withheld, all athletes nominated to the Team should arrange for appropriate time off from school, work or other obligations in advance. Waivers will primarily be granted for injury or other similar incapacity or for a personal/family emergency. Requests for a waiver must be submitted in writing to the Women's Program Vice President as far in advance as possible.

SECTION 8: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

USA Gymnastics will nominate the Team, including any replacements, on or before October 2, 2026.

SECTION 9: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

9.1 NGB JURISDICTION

- An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USA Gymnastics may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:
 - Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to the USA Gymnastics Chief Programs Officer and the Women's Program Vice President requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - Injury or illness. Injury or illness that inhibits peak performance, which shall be determined by an examining physician, with medical documentation, verified by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff.
 - Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the [USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct](#).
 - Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed [USA Gymnastics National Team Agreement](#).
 - Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 3 of these selection procedures.
- An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated IOC, WADA, IF, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and USA Gymnastics Safety and Response policies, as applicable.
- Removal may only occur by action of the President of USA Gymnastics and the Women's Program Athlete Selection Representative (or another Athlete Representative appointed by the USA Gymnastics Athletes' Council in the case of a conflict of interest) after consultation with the Selection Committee, and an interview with the athlete and her coach. An athlete who is removed

from the 2026 World Championships Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per [USA Gymnastics Grievance policy](#) and the [USOPC Bylaws](#) (Section 9).

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1** Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, the Athlete Selection Committee will designate one (1) of the named traveling or non-traveling replacement athletes to be nominated to the 2026 World Championships Team utilizing the discretionary criteria listed in Section 5, based on team needs and medal potential.
- 10.2** All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 3.

SECTION 11: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 11.1** Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the LOC, if allowed, the Athlete Selection Committee will designate one (1) of the named traveling or non-traveling replacement athletes to be nominated to the 2026 World Championships Team utilizing the discretionary criteria listed in Section 5, based on team needs and medal potential.
- 11.2** Any replacement of athletes must comply with these selection procedures in addition to World Gymnastics regulations including applicable Late Athlete Replacement (LAR) policies.
- 11.3** All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 3.

SECTION 12: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per the USA Gymnastics' complaint procedures <https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/Governance/grievance.pdf> and the USOPC Bylaws, Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 13: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

SECTION 14: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on IF rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in IF rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Gymnastics.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 15: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 6.4) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 20) must comply with the USA Gymnastics' Conflict of Interest Policy https://static.usagym.org/PDFs/About%20USA%20Gymnastics/Governance/coi_policy.pdf to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USA Gymnastics' Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

SECTION 18: NON-RETALIATION

The USOPC and USA Gymnastics have zero tolerance for retaliation against people who make good faith reports of potential ethical, policy, or legal violations, or who cooperate with investigations of those reports. That means no USOPC or USA Gymnastics staff, Board or Committee member, or volunteer may threaten, harass, discriminate against, or take any negative employment or related action (e.g., discharge, demotion, suspension, negative review) on that basis.

SECTION 19: SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

USA Gymnastics will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents from the selection process.

A Selection Committee report signed by the Independent Observer, outlining the work and decisions of the Committee, will be made available for distribution to all athletes and coaches who participated in the Selection Events at least 14 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, unless the Selection Committee meeting occurs less than 30 days before the nominative deadline for the event for which the team is being selected, in which case the minutes will be published within a reasonable timeframe after the Selection Committee meeting under the circumstances. The report will be made public on the USA Gymnastics website. USA Gymnastics retains the sole discretion to determine the contents and timing of the report.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Paralympic Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted to the USOPC by an NGB for participation in a Delegation Event.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
