A. Function

The Trampoline & Tumbling Program ("Program") is composed of the Trampoline & Tumbling Program Committee (PC) and its sub-committees. These sub-committees include the Trampoline & Tumbling Selection Committees (SCs), Trampoline & Tumbling Elite Committees (ECs), Trampoline & Tumbling Development Committees (DCs), and the Trampoline & Tumbling Technical Committees (TCs). The sub-committees are charged with specific T&T Program tasks (see specific descriptions below). Other sub-committees may be created by the PC as deemed necessary. All committee members must be active USA Gymnastics Competitive Coach, Judge, Owner/Managing Director, or Meet Director members.

D. Elections

- 1. A person may not accept more than one nomination within a single set of elections, for committee positions within the same committee.
- 2. Election is by simple majority of votes cast.
- 3. When a ballot has more than 4 nominees, a nominee must either win a majority of the votes, or a runoff be held between the candidates with the two highest number of votes cast.
- 4. In case of a tie, a runoff election will be conducted between the two candidates with the highest number of votes until one candidate receives a simple majority of the votes cast.
- 5. The runoff election will be conducted no later than 30 days following the election. The runoff election closes 30 days after the ballot is posted on the website.

E. Voting

- 1. For all USA Gymnastics T&T Committees:
 - a. All members of the Committees will adhere to the USA Gymnastics' Conflict of Interest Policy.
 - b. When dealing with voting issues a quorum must be present at the time of voting. A majority of the voting Committee members present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum. Once a quorum is established, a majority vote of the present Committee members shall constitute action of the Committee.
 - c. A majority vote is the majority of the votes cast.
 - d. Each committee member may only cast one vote, regardless of the number of positions they hold. A person holding more than one position should declare the position from which their vote will be cast, for example:
 - i. A member holding more than one State Chair position should advise which state they will be voting on behalf of.
 - ii. A Region Chair also holding a State Chair position should advise whether they will be voting as the State Chair, or breaking any tie as the Region Chair.
