

This change helps us provide accurate, up-to-date information more quickly and efficiently—while making it easier for you to stay informed.





Exams will resume Aug 1, 2026, with the implementation of the 2026-2030 Dev *Code of Points*.




# GENERAL



# MEMBERSHIP ROLE PHOTOGRAPHER RESTRICTIONS

Any private club or contracted photographer/videographer must have an agreement with the Meet Director and is **not permitted to hold a dual role** (e.g., coach and photographer) while present on the field of play.






## **ACCEPTABLE ATHLETE ATTIRE**

## **BRA STRAPS**

PREVIOUSLY: Only clear bra straps allowed

NEW: Sports bra, with exposed straps, may be black, match the leotard, be the athlete's skin tone, or clear in color.





# MEET DIRECTOR RESPONSIBILITIES PRE-MEET REQUIREMENT

Meet Directors must notify clubs of any rotation or session splits **prior to the competition start**date to help prevent scheduling conflicts and to allow time for clubs to add additional coaches to the sanction if needed.






# VERIFICATION HEAT SHEETS STATE MEETS AND ABOVE

# At State meets and above - Verification heat sheets are required to be used.

At local or invitational meets, their use is left to the discretion of the Meet Director.

- If a verification sheet is not used, the Chief Judge must document:
  - both individual scores
  - the average score
  - any neutral deductions.





# TIMED WARM-UP PRODEDURES UPDATE TO REFLECT ALL EVENTS

**PREVIOUSLY:** At State and above...

NEW: At all sanctioned events: if a Level 9 and/or Level 10 squad has fewer than five athletes (i.e., four or fewer) on Uneven Bars due to onsite scratches or unforeseen circumstances, an additional 2½-minute timed warm-up may be provided.

This additional warm-up time must include bar settings.






# MEDICAL ASSESSMENT RESUMING COMPETITION

If an athlete requires medical assessment due to injury:

- They may complete the routine and resume competition within the same session once medically cleared.
- A 30-second touch warm-up may be allowed upon return.





# ENTRY & DROP BACK PROCEDURES PETITION APPROVAL

**Levels 8 and below:** Petitions must be submitted to the State Administrative Committee Chairman (SACC), with final approval made by the State Administrative Committee (SAC).

**Levels 9 and above:** Petitions must be submitted to the Regional Administrative Committee Chairman (RACC), with final approval made by the Regional Administrative Committee (RAC).






# MOBILITY NEW RE-ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Any athlete who has prior competitive experience in the Development Program and then competes in a State meet under an alternative program (e.g., Xcel or another gymnastics organization) must submit a petition to re-enter the Development Program at Level 5 or higher.

**Levels 5–8:** Petitions must be submitted to the SAC.

Levels 9-10: Petitions must be submitted to the RAC.






# REGIONAL PETITON PROCESS TO INCLUDE LEVEL 6 & 7

**Level 6:** Gymnasts who competed in the previous year's Level 6 Regional Championships...

**Level 7**: Gymnasts who competed in the previous year's Level 7 Regional Championships...

... and achieved an Optional All-Around (AA) score at least 1.00 point above the current Regional qualifying score may use that previous Regional score as their pre-State Championships score.

# VIDEO REVIEW PROCESS JUDGES' AFFILIATION WITH EVENT

At all sanctioned competitions, a coach may request a video review by the Meet Referee and highest rated **judge unaffiliated** with that event (if video is available) following an inquiry.

If the Meet Referee or highest rated judge is affiliated with the athlete in question, the video review will be conducted by the next two (2) highest rated judges **unaffiliated with the athlete**, or the highest rated unaffiliated judge and a USA Gymnastics officer.




## **REGIONAL JUDGE SELECTION PROCESS**

**REGIONALS**: In consultation with the RACC and approval of the RTCC, the RAC selects the officials for Regional competitions.

- 1. Each SAC must submit their recommendations in rank order (or groups in rank order) to the RTCC.
- 2. Rotation of officials is not required but may be considered.
- 3. The RTCC, if unavailable, selects the Meet Referee, in consultation with the RACC.

Regional Administrative Committee Chairman (RACC) to be included in the process of receiving judge recommendations submitted by the State Administrative Committee (SAC).






# XCEL JUDGING PANEL REQUIREMENTS

#### AT ALL XCEL COMPETITIONS:

• A two (2) judge panel is **required** at the Platinum, Diamond, and Sapphire Divisions for all mobility and qualifying meets.

 A one (1) judge panel may be used for mobility at Bronze, Silver, and Gold.





## JUDGES' EXAMS LEVEL 6/7 & 8

Beginning August 1, 2026, an online 50 Question Level 6/7
Theoretical exam will be a prerequisite for applicants obtaining a Level 8 Judges rating.

The Level 8 exam will consist of a 50 Question, Level 8 only, Theoretical exam and a Level 8 Practical exam.





## **ALLOWABLE EQUIPMENT**

PREVIOUSLY: Allowed to perform "timer" for Salto vault (DEV LEVELS 8-10 and XCEL DIAMOND AND ABOVE) during warm-ups only

NEW: If available on an event - An alternate skill cushion made of softer foam is allowed to be used in warm-ups at all sanctioned competitions.






### EQUIPMENT ALLOWABLE PLACEMENT OF MAT STACK

### **LEVEL 1, 2, AND 3:**


The mat stack may be placed on the floor, on the Vault runway, or on the competition landing mat (CLM).






## **EQUIPMENT LEVEL 6/7 MAT STACK**

The sting mat MAY BE INCLUDED as an allowable component in the configuration of the Level 6/7 Vault Mat Stack to meet the required height (matting must be equal to or higher than the underside of the top of the vault table).







## EQUIPMENT VAULT TABLE HEIGHT REQUIREMENT

#### **DEV LEVELS 8-10**

All age divisions may use the Vault table with a minimum setting of 115 cm (± 1 cm) and a maximum of 135 cm (± 1 cm).

NEW: Levels 8-10 may use the Vault table at any manufacturer setting, with a maximum of 135 cm (+ 1 cm).





# BARS



### BARS CLARIFICATION ON CJ DEDUCTION

0.20

Coach sprays water or adds chalk to UB once exercise has begun (No warning will be given)

Once exercise has begun = actively competing on the equipment

This does not apply if the athlete has fallen and is off the equipment.





### BARS EQUIPMENT FAILURE

If the bar cable tension slips while an athlete is competing (after the coach has tightened the tension prior to the start of the routine), it is considered equipment failure.

The <u>0.50</u> Fall deduction would not apply.





#### BARS LEVEL 5 DISMOUNT

#### WHEN COACH SPOTS / ASSISTS DURING AN ELEMENT:

- eliminate the deduction of up to the value of the element of a Flyaway in tuck, pike, or layout position.
- Deduct <u>**0.50**</u> for the spot (in addition to any applicable execution errors).





#### BARS VALUE INCREASE

Stalder forward to handstand with 1/1 (360°) turn on one arm after handstand phase

(Healy technique) to L or mixed-L grip



Previously: 6.301 "C"



NEW: 6.401 "D"





### **BARS NEW LEVEL 9/10 CHOICE OF ELEMENT**

Choice of elements (applicable to Level 9 / 10 only)

Failure to perform two elements that fulfill two out of three of the following requirements (excluding dismounts):

- 1. One forward element (circle or release) (minimum of "B")
- 2. One element from Groups 3 / 6 / 7 (minimum of "B")
- 3. One element with a minimum of 180° LA turn, with or without flight (minimum of "C")

One out of three requirements performed.

None of the three requirements performed.

#### FOURTH CHOICE ADDED

4. One Single Bar release (minimum of "D")






# BEAM



#### BEAM LEVEL 1-5 MOUNTS



Place both hands shoulder-width apart on the beam and jump to a **FRONT SUPPORT** with the arms straight and body extended.

#### **CLARIFICATION ON ARM PLACEMENT - ADDING TO TEXT**

Place both hands shoulder-width apart on the beam (left hand can be straight or sideways) and jump to a FRONT SUPPORT to finish with arms straight and body extended.






## BEAM EQUIPMENT FAILURE

If the Balance Beam end cap detaches WHILE AN ATHLETE IS IN THE PROCESS OF A DISMOUNT, it is considered equipment failure.


The <u>0.50</u> Fall deduction **WOULD NOT APPLY**.

The end cap falling off during any other point in the athlete's routine would not be considered equipment failure.





## EQUIPMENT NEW BEAM MATTING REQUIREMENT



For competitions held in outside facilities: Beam dismount matting requirements to include a minimum of 4 feet by 4 feet of padding between the end of the Beam and the under-Beam matting.

This padding may consist of panel mats, carpet-bonded foam, or similar materials.



### FLOOR NEW DEDUCTION



A <u>0.50</u> deduction will be applied if a gymnast leaves the floor during the routine.

This deduction should not be taken in addition to a fall out of bounds or a fall immediately preceding the gymnast leaving the floor for medical evaluation.





## **EQUIPMENT**UPDATED FLOOR MATTING REQUIREMENT

Only one (1) skill cushion/throw mat (4 inch or sech) per tumbling pass may be used, with no more than two (2) mats on the Floor Exercise area at any one point in time. Matting may be used as a take-off / landing surface.

# At all sanctioned competitions: TWO (2) 4-INCH MATS WILL BE ALLOWED

(replacing the previous allowance of one (1) 4-inch mat and one (1) 8-inch mat).

The two (2) 4-inch mats may be stacked to achieve previous 8-inch allowance.





### FLOOR ALLOWABLE PLACEMENT OF MATTING

# All matting must be in place PRIOR TO THE START OF THE ROUTINE AND CANNOT BE ADDED ONCE THE ROUTINE HAS STARTED.

A <u>0.30</u> unauthorized use of matting deduction will be applied if matting is added <u>after the exercise has begun</u>.

Mats may be removed during a routine only if taken from the nearest boundary line. The person removing the matting should stay outside the floor area as much as possible. Briefly stepping inside the border marking to remove mats will not result in a deduction.





### FLOOR ADD TO APPENDIX 15

#### UP TO 0.20 CHOICE OF FLOOR ACRO (SALTO) ELEMENTS NOT UP TO THE COMPETITIVE LEVEL - SALTOS MAY BE IN ANY ORDER

- Formulas are based on 4 Saltos performed in a routine; regardless of Direct/Indirect connections or whether saltos are isolated or within an Acro pass.
- There will be an additional 0.05 deduction for each Salto missing from a formula.
- It is impossible to represent all combinations of Saltos. Apply the formula that most closely fits the Saltos performed.



#### FLOOR MUSIC APPROVAL

#### 2024 motion RESCINDED

CODE OF POINTS Floor Music – Recommendation to update the DEV COP, Xcel COP, and the R&P: Beginning August 1, 2026, the use of human or synthesized voice in floor music to create words, sounds, chanting, etc. will no longer be allowed. A 1.00 CJ deduction will be taken for any floor music with voice.

The current music approval process is in effect for the 2025-26 season.





### FLOOR DECREASED MUSIC DEDUCTION

### Decrease the Chief Judge deduction:



Absence of music or music with words or song / speech

**Updated deduction - 0.50** 

\*A music approval subcommittee will be established of national committee members who will define a new music approval process to begin August 1, 2026.






### VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA CLARIFICATION

For any volunteer leader (elected and appointed) who claims dual residency (e.g., living in one state and working in another):

INDIVIDUALS MUST DECLARE A SINGLE STATE AFFILIATION AND ARE ONLY ELIGIBLE TO RUN FOR, BE APPOINTED TO, AND VOTE ON ONE STATE COMMITTEE.







**State Committee Appointments:** Additional members may be appointed by the State Administrative Committee Chair (SACC) with approval from the State Administrative Committee (SAC).






### VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP ASSISTANT CHAIRMAN ELECTION UPDATE

If the State Administrative Committee Chair (SACC) deems it necessary, an Assistant Committee Chairman may be appointed by the SACC, with approval from the State Administrative Committee (SAC).






### VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP REMOVAL PROCEDURES UPDATED

National Administrative Committee Chair (NACC) has the authority to collaborate with the Women's Program Committee Chair (WPCC) and the USA Gymnastics national office in the removal of a State Administrative Committee Chair (SACC) or Regional Administrative Committee Chair (RACC) in cases of financial negligence, egregious behavior, or similar serious misconduct.





### VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT UPDATE

#### SECTION J - REGIONAL TECHNICAL COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN (RTCC)

- 1. Must be a Brevet or hold a National rating for a minimum of two (2) cycles.
- 2. Must have been assigned to judge Level 9 Easterns or Westerns and Level 10 National Championships in the current or previous cycle.

Update to previous 10 years add OR;

3. Must have coached athletes that competed at Level 9 Easterns/Westerns and Level 10 Dev Nationals in the previous 10 years and are actively judging.





### SANCTION VIOLATIONS CONSIDERATION FOR TIERED PENALTY SYSTEM

Recommendation to consider a tiered penalty system for egregious and/or repeated sanction violations.





## PROPOSED ENTRY FEE INCREASE LEVEL 9 EAST/WEST & LEVEL 10 NATIONALS

Recommendation to increase entry fees for Level 9 Eastern/Western Championships & Level 10 National Championships to:

\$225

Entry fee guidelines as currently listed in the Rules & Policies still apply for State and Regional events.
