


MEMBERSHIP ROLE PHOTOGRAPHER RESTRICTIONS

RULES & POLICIES

Any private club or contracted photographer/videographer must have an agreement with the Meet Director and is **not permitted to hold a dual role** (e.g., coach and photographer) while present on the field of play.






ACCEPTABLE ATHLETE ATTIRE

BRA STRAPS

PREVIOUSLY: Only clear bra straps allowed

NEW: Sports bra, with exposed straps, may be black, match the leotard, be the athlete's skin tone, or clear in color.






MEET DIRECTOR RESPONSIBILITIES

PRE-MEET REQUIREMENT

RULES & POLICIES

Meet Directors must notify clubs of any rotation or session splits **prior to the competition start date** to help prevent scheduling conflicts and to allow time for clubs to add additional coaches to the sanction if needed.





VERIFICATION HEAT SHEETS


STATE MEETS AND ABOVE

At State meets and above – Verification heat sheets are required to be used.

At local or invitational meets, their use is left to the discretion of the Meet Director.

- If a verification sheet is not used, the Chief Judge must document:
 - both individual scores
 - the average score
 - any neutral deductions.





TIMED WARM-UP PROCEDURES


UPDATE TO REFLECT ALL EVENTS

PREVIOUSLY: At State and above...

NEW: **At all sanctioned events:** if a Level 9 and/or Level 10 squad has fewer than five athletes (i.e., four or fewer) on Uneven Bars due to onsite scratches or unforeseen circumstances, an additional 2½-minute timed warm-up may be provided.

This additional warm-up time must include bar settings.






MEDICAL ASSESSMENT RESUMING COMPETITION

If an athlete requires medical assessment due to injury:

- They may complete the routine and resume competition within the same session once medically cleared.
- A 30-second touch warm-up may be allowed upon return.



Levels 9 and above: Petitions must be submitted to the Regional Administrative Committee Chairman (RACC), with final approval made by the Regional Administrative Committee (RAC).

NEW RE-ENTRY REQUIREMENTS


RULES & POLICIES

Any athlete who has prior competitive experience in the Development Program and then competes in a State meet under an alternative program (e.g., Xcel or another gymnastics organization) must submit a petition to re-enter the Development Program at Level 5 or higher.

Levels 5–8: Petitions must be submitted to the SAC.

Levels 9–10: Petitions must be submitted to the RAC.






JUDGES' AFFILIATION WITH EVENT

RULES & POLICIES

At all sanctioned competitions, a coach may request a video review by the Meet Referee and highest rated **judge unaffiliated with that event** (if video is available) following an inquiry.

If the Meet Referee or highest rated judge is affiliated with the athlete in question, the video review will be conducted by the next two (2) highest rated judges **unaffiliated with the athlete**, or the highest rated unaffiliated judge and a USA Gymnastics officer.





REGIONAL JUDGE SELECTION PROCESS


REGIONALS: In consultation with the RACC and approval of the RTCC, the RAC selects the officials for Regional competitions.

1. Each SAC must submit their recommendations in rank order (or groups in rank order) to the RTCC.
2. Rotation of officials is not required but may be considered.
3. The RTCC, if unavailable, selects the Meet Referee, in consultation with the RACC.


XCEL JUDGING PANEL REQUIREMENTS

RULES & POLICES

AT ALL XCEL COMPETITIONS:

- A two (2) judge panel is **required** at the Platinum, Diamond, and Sapphire Divisions for all mobility and qualifying meets.
- A one (1) judge panel may be used for mobility at Bronze, Silver, and Gold.



Beginning August 1, 2026, an online 50 Question Level 6/7 Theoretical exam will be a prerequisite for applicants obtaining a Level 8 Judges rating.

The Level 8 exam will consist of a 50 Question, Level 8 only, Theoretical exam and a Level 8 Practical exam.

The sting mat **MAY BE INCLUDED** as an allowable component in the configuration of the Level 6/7 Vault Mat Stack to meet the **required height** (matting must be equal to or higher than the underside of the top of the vault table).

DEV LEVELS 8-10

- All age divisions may use the Vault table with a ~~minimum setting of 115 cm (\pm 1 cm)~~ and a maximum of 135 cm (\pm 1 cm).




EQUIPMENT FAILURE

CODE OF POINTS

If the bar cable tension slips while an athlete is competing (**after the coach has tightened the tension prior to the start of the routine**), it is considered equipment failure.

The 0.50 Fall deduction would not apply.







WHEN COACH SPOTS / ASSISTS DURING AN ELEMENT:

- eliminate the deduction of up to the value of the element of a Flyaway in tuck, pike, or layout position.

Place both hands shoulder-width apart on the beam (left hand can be straight or sideways) and jump to a **FRONT SUPPORT** **to finish** with arms straight and body extended.



BEAM EQUIPMENT FAILURE


CODE OF POINTS

If the Balance Beam end cap detaches **WHILE AN ATHLETE IS IN THE PROCESS OF A DISMOUNT**, it is considered equipment failure.

The 0.50 Fall deduction **WOULD NOT APPLY**.

The end cap falling off during any other point in the athlete's routine would not be considered equipment failure.





For competitions held in outside facilities: Beam dismount matting requirements to include a minimum of 4 feet by 4 feet of padding between the end of the Beam and the under-Beam matting.

This padding may consist of panel mats, carpet-bonded foam, or similar materials.




A **0.50 deduction** will be applied if a **gymnast leaves the floor during the routine.**

This deduction should not be taken in addition to a fall out of bounds or a fall immediately preceding the gymnast leaving the floor for medical evaluation.


UPDATED FLOOR MATTING REQUIREMENT

Only one (1) skill cushion/throw mat (4 inch or ~~8~~ inch) *per tumbling pass* may be used, with no more than two (2) mats on the Floor Exercise area at any one point in time. Matting may be used as a take-off / landing surface.

At all sanctioned competitions:
TWO (2) 4-INCH MATS WILL BE ALLOWED
(replacing the previous allowance of one (1) 4-inch mat and one (1) 8-inch mat).

The two (2) 4-inch mats may be stacked to achieve previous 8-inch allowance.

ALLOWABLE PLACEMENT OF MATTING


CODE OF POINTS

All matting must be in place PRIOR TO THE START OF THE ROUTINE AND CANNOT BE ADDED ONCE THE ROUTINE HAS STARTED.

A 0.30 unauthorized use of matting deduction will be applied if matting is added after the exercise has begun.

Mats may be removed during a routine only if taken from the nearest boundary line. The person removing the matting should stay outside the floor area as much as possible. Briefly stepping inside the border marking to remove mats will not result in a deduction.





FLOOR ADD TO APPENDIX 15

CODE OF POINTS

UP TO 0.20 CHOICE OF FLOOR ACRO (SALTO) ELEMENTS NOT UP TO THE COMPETITIVE LEVEL – SALTOS MAY BE IN ANY ORDER

- Formulas are based on 4 Saltos performed in a routine; regardless of Direct/Indirect connections or whether saltos are isolated or within an Acro pass.
- There will be an additional 0.05 deduction for each Salto missing from a formula.
- It is impossible to represent all combinations of Saltos. Apply the formula that most closely fits the Saltos performed.


